



A warplane plant and a Navy ship repair yard might top the list. Behind them in order might come a cargo-shipbuilding yard, a shell-loading plant, and a tank factory. The Urgency committee gives its list of plants to the Manpower

Company AAA makes plan Company AAA makes planes for the Army. Company BBB, a subcontractor, makes vital parts for those planes. Therefore both are working for the Army which is represented on the priorities committee.

Asks Survey of Needs

The Army calls in AAA and BBB and asks them to survey their manpower needs critically; reduce the number of their workers if possible by letting some go or making better use of those they have; or determine the mini-mum number of new workers

they have; or determine the minimum number of new workers needed.

Company AAA finds it needs 30 welders. Company BBB needs 15 electricians.

In the meantime all war plants in the area have agreed to do their hiring only from among workers sent them by sources like the U. S. Employment service or labor unions. This is called "controlled referral."

So job-seeking workers go to those hiring sources, both of which have been informed by the Manpower Priorities committee that Plants AAA and BBB are to get first call on all welders and get first call on all welders and electricians until their needs are

electricians until their needs are filled.

But if John Jones, welder, is directed to Company AAA and has a good reason for not wanting to work there—such as its distance from his home—he will be sent to a plant which, closer to his home, also needs welders but ranks behind Plant AAA on the urgency list.

Can Refuse Another Job

If Jones refuses to go to Plant AAA for reasons not considered good by the hiring sources, then the employment sources can refuse to send him to another welding job.


