London, Nov. 23.—(AP)—In the heaviest aerial bombardment in history, the R.A.F. engulfed Berlin last night with fire and devastating explosives. Bombers from 1,000 bombers, more than 2,300 tons of high explosives and incendiaries were dropped on the world's third largest city, it was officially stated tonight.
