**Skill A Slight Chance**  
 Now that the House has indulged itself in the luxury of extreme subservience to political and economic pressure groups who think the battle against subsidies will be of benefit to them, even though it may actually hurt the welfare of the country as a whole, there is only a slim, cynical hope for the future.  
 This lies in the possibility that, having expressed their faith in their own subservient vote on Tuesday, some members of the House—perhaps enough to sustain the expected presidential majority—now choose to play the game trickily safe by changing their vote next time. Having shown the "arm bloc" that their vote is in the right place, such politically minded congressmen may still clinch from leaving upon themselves the public relations burden to develop eventually if the present effort to raise the cost of living for all Americans should win out.  
 Or the change of some votes may be something less tricky. The people, as always, are slow to awake to an issue, even when it is reaching directly into their own pocketbooks. The awakening on this particular issue has been especially slow, because it has required admission that subsidies, the thing to be defended in this instance, are themselves evil, and only to be defended because the alternative is so much the greater evil. But there may be congressmen who, in the next few weeks, will find that their constituents have finally realized what is going on.

**We'll Trust Eisenhower**  
 Whether the punishment of Lieut. Gen. George S. Patton, Jr., should proceed to new measures, it is only necessary to remember that there is a margin of only one vote which kept Congress from disbanding, four months before Pearl Harbor, the army we had begun to raise and train. We still shudder at the closeness of that call, and wonder what providence tipped the scale so gently in favor of this nation's survival. But, by such a narrow margin, the right thing did happen. There could not be a margin that slight chance that this nation will pull itself back from the brink of a terrible defeat. But that slight chance may materialize, and it is something to fight for. Let your congressman, and your senators, know you want the cost of living kept down.

**Soviet Press In A New Line**  
 The Soviet government controlled press seemingly needs a little time to untrack itself from one line of thought and start on another. But there are currently signs that it is beginning to adjust itself to the results of the Moscow Conference.  
 Where, before that conference, the Soviet press specialized in bold pronouncements of the fact that Russia would select her own officers, and had luck to any one else who dared discuss the question, two Soviet publications have now veered around to a most encouraging discussion of the principle of "self-determination."  
 By this principle, Russia is now declared to be determined, that the peoples of Europe shall be allowed to decide upon their own post-war governments. The announcement of this principle is accompanied by that death of any Moscow desire to impose the Soviet form of government on any people. In return for this, Soviet policy is now revealed as also determined that either the governments of conquered nations be barred from return until the people shall have made their choice. If Soviet Russia in "yielding" to the Moscow Conference, she is willing to help Japan die.

**Report Denies Police Laxity**

Moscow, Nov. 27.—(AP)—The Army newspaper Red Star said today that the Russians had crossed the Berezina river, inflicting a new blow on the disorganized German Army along the stream where Napoleon's legions met their final defeat during the retreat from Moscow.
