"We came here with hope and determination," the declaration says by the three said. "We leave you in fact, in spirit and in purpose."

Some Washington authorities said that the two sentences represented one of the major accomplishments of the meeting, which was held when it began, was no assurance that such a high degree of unity would be maintained.
