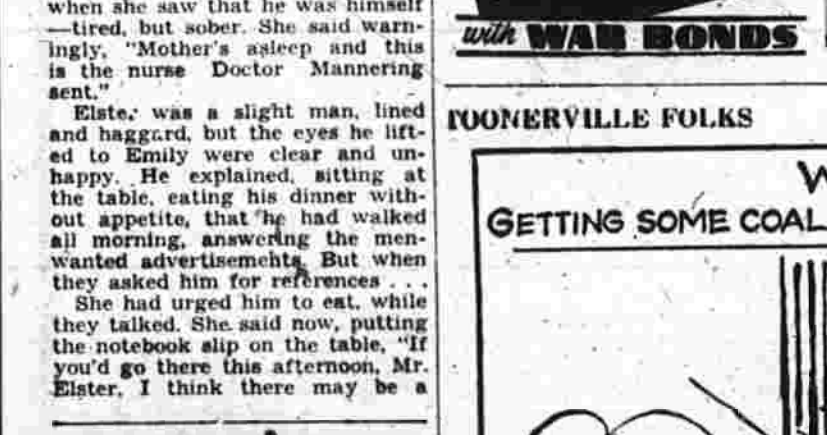

Deaths Reach Six-Year High. London, Dec. 11.—(AP)—Influenza deaths reached a six-year high in the week ended last Saturday, when 700 persons succumbed to the disease in 128 major towns of England and Wales. It was the largest weekly toll since the week of Oct. 19, 1937, when 975 died. The previous worst in this was in February, 1918, with 823 fatalities.
