

### Medicine Control To Be Opposed

Atlanta, Dec. 21-P-The "majority of civilians, and certainly the medical profession, will oppose to the last any attempt to establish bureaucratic or dictatorial control of medicine," says Dr. lames E. Paullin of Atlanta, president of the American Medical Association and the American College of Physicians.

Addressing the graduating class of Emory University last night, Dr. Paullin said that "we must not allow the present emer-

gency to be used as an excuse to force upon the American people bureaucratic control of individuals and professions where it is not justified." Paullin said "one striking example" is an "effort on the part of

some to gain complete control of all medical services in this coun-try by placing them under the dic-tatorial control of the surgeon general of the U. S. Public Health Service." This, he said, is contemplated" under the Wagner-Murray-Dingell bill now pending in Congress.

**Guerrillas Using** Stolen Warrants

Barcelona, Dec. 21-(P)-French guerrillas and underground operatives are turning the tables on Heinrich Himmler's secret police (French branch) and collaborationists by using stolen Nazi search warrants, according to Paris newspapers reaching here

today.

The newspapers carried front page notices offering large re-wards for information leading to the arrest and detention of French "terrorists" who have seized quantities of the warrants signed by Himmler's secret police. The guerrillas were said to be using them in their war against collab orationists. Guerrilla columns were also re ported to have laid seige near Lyon to a detachment of French Legion militia, supposedly the main civilian support of the Vichy rovernment but said to be, in fact, out and out collaborationists.

The militia reportedly have arge stores of arms and ammusition in their fortified chateau on a hill overlooking the city.
