

8th Army Seizes Vezzani in Drive; Dig Out Germans

Wet, wintry weather handicaps all operations on entire Italian front; bombers pound railroad on Riviera in 3 places.

Allied Headquarters, Algiers, Dec. 24.—(P)—Fighting in snow and rain, the Eighth Army has driven northward and captured the southwest of Ortona and the Canadians are digging the last Germans out of Ortona today. The whole Italian front was blanketed by wet, wintry weather which handicapped operations both ground and in the air.

Bombers Pound Railroad
American infantry of the Fifth Army plodded through the snow to take one high point but was pushed off another. Marauder Force pounded the railroad along the French-Italian Riviera in three places.

The most violent fighting continued in the Ortona area where the Germans battled desperately to retain the eastern anchor of their crumbling defense line. A military commentator said that the enemy still held one of the Ortona area and that many of the Germans were sticking to the death rather than retreat. This had turned the Canadians' struggle for the city into a house and house campaign with bayonets and hand grenades.

Pressing Relentlessly North
Other units of Gen. Sir Bernard Montgomery's Eighth Army were pressing relentlessly northward despite the intolerable weather. Vezzani, the village which the British captured yesterday, is about a mile north of the highway between Ortona and Orongno.

Weather limited action on the Fifth Army front largely to patrolling and in the only two decisive moves announced in today's bulletin.

Bomber Fleet Pounds Berlin Attack Brings Destruction of Capital Near Three-Quarters Mark

London, Dec. 22.—(P)—A great fleet of R.A.F. bombers gave Berlin its seventh big attack in five weeks last night, with a loss of more than 30 planes, the lowest toll yet for a major operation. The attack probably brought destruction of the German capital near the three-quarters mark.

Switch Fuel Tactics

Some 4,000 Allied bombers delivered some 7,000 or 8,000 tons of bombs to the enemy. This may be Allied bombing power close to the peak which has been our long objective. What these bombers are doing is to get into many compartments. Most of them are aimed at the twin, side-by-side objectives of German war production and German home front morale. Others are making a great show of attacking supposed rocket gun emplacements on the French coast. Our air command and the Nazis both know whether such emplacements are really our objective or whether we are beginning the task of clearing an invasion path, but all we can do is speculate. Other bombers by night are hitting objectives, warning Nazi satellites that their time is short.

That there may be something more than routine work in these operations is suggested by the fact that Nazi defenses, fighter defenses in particular, are being more fiercely than has been their habit during past months. Although it is the smaller share of the Allied bomb load which is going to the Japs in the South Pacific, the results there are more immediate and spectacular. The toughness of the Jap does not extend to the Jap in the air. We rule the skies of the South Pacific as we do not yet by any means rule the skies of Europe. Although it is a battle area of wide spaces and deep jungles, the places for which men fight are small and well-marked. We bomb them practically as we please, probably with the finest accuracy of any bombing yet done in this war.

Such operations are driving Jap air power back. It is becoming more and more certain that where Jap air power can be driven back, the Jap does not venture, nor does he even Jap land forces long remain, as witness the present Jap retreat on Guadalcanal, well in advance of actual land pressure from us. What we are doing in the South Pacific is to date to top from one air field to another. Such blows do not always come from the sky, but they do determine its eventual outcome. Our air umbrella is being pushed forward, the Jap, with all his jungle tactics, is finding a modern war after all, and he hasn't got planes or men good enough to win it.

These after many months of production and training, the Allied air war is truly coming into its own. Its power, and its effectiveness, so far as we can estimate it, are both thrilling. They will not grow less. The enemy is just beginning to know what air war really is.

Whether or not, as individuals, we have all kept memory and friendship enough to send Christmas gifts or sentiments to those men and women who serve us, there is one mass gift that can be sent. It would be good at this late date, welcome whenever it might be delivered. This common gift from the American people to the defenders of America would, in turn, have to be made up of individual responses. But it could be so made up, and it could be so sent, if enough of us deeply wanted to feel this war happily enough.

What could be sent to the men and women who are in the front lines for America is simply this: an assurance that we at home are backing them, and that, doing so, we have no time or hearts to be fighting among ourselves over how much we are going to get out of their front line sacrifice. We could send them no word that would hearten them more; no more convincing testimonial of the fact that we are thinking of them; no more precious gift is within our power. And, as a matter of fact, unless we can and do send that one gift, something soon in the course of all those individual and group actions which add up to what America at home is doing, we will never have the right to stand with them in the hour of their victory, when their hands, though bloody, shall be clean, and their hearts, though tried, shall be pure with thought, unspending sacrifice. How shall ours be?

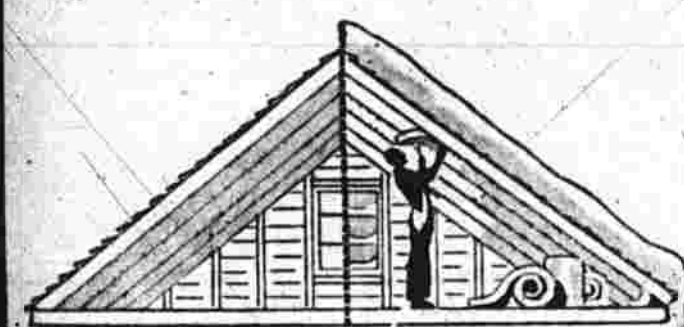
