

Production Outlook Good
Explaining the deductions, OPA said supplies of snap beans are at a fairly high level and that production outlook is good. A decline in consumer demand of over 10 per cent in the last two months makes possible the lower point values on peas and tomotoes.

These three items, the agency make up about 25 per cent of all rationed processed foods.

Ration values on most frozen foods are cut to zero in a move to hustle these items out of storage reeing urgently needed freezer spage for record amounts of pork coming to market.

The point values of frozen corn, peas and lima beans comain unchanged, but all other frozen vegetables are made point-free, compared with December ratings of 12 points a pound for spinach at the top of the range and two points for beets and carrots at the bottom.


