Urges Walker Start Action

Vandenberg Asks Democrats to Eliminate Foreign Policy Issue.

Washington, Jan. 7.—(AP)—Senator Vandenberg (R-Mich.) today challenged Democratic National Chairman Frank Walker to take the initiative in accepting what the senator called a four-month-old invitation of Republicans to eliminate the foreign policy issue from the presidential campaign.

Vandenberg told a reporter that Walker's statement in an interview yesterday that the important thing for this country now is "to adopt an international policy that is worthwhile and plan for the peace" ought to be followed by action on the part of the Democrats.

"It would be very interesting if Mr. Walker would implement his wishful thinking by indicating where, when and how the Democratic party either has spoken as definitely on foreign policy as the Republicans did at Mackinac, or whether he or it has or will move to accept the invitation extended to him there last September," the Michigan senator declared.

Party Support Pledged

Vandenberg alluded to a foreign policy resolution adopted by a committee he headed and subsequently ratified by the Republican Post-War Advisory Council, pledging the party to support "responsible participation in the United States in post-war cooperative organization among sovereign nations to prevent military aggression and to attain permanent peace, with organized justice in a free world."

Vandenberg added attention to the fact that the resolution concluded with an invitation to "all Americans to adhere to the principles here set forth to the end that our place among the nations of the world and our part in helping to

Bolivia Revolt Being Studied

19 American Nations Exchange Information on Influences.

Washington, Jan. 7.—(AP)—Nineteen American nations bent on routing out Axis political influences in this hemisphere today exchanged information on the forces that put a revolutionary government in power in Bolivia of Dec. 20.

A full exchange of information began among Washington and the 18 other capitals regarding the suspected influences which have contributed to the accession of the new Bolivian president, General Gualberto Villarroel.

On the basis of this information, the nations agreed to form an American Emergency Advisory Committee for Political, Diplomatic and Economic Affairs, which include all sovereign states except Bolivia and Argentina, then decide whether to accord the government at La Paz friendly recognition or to take measures which in effect would isolate Bolivia from the rest of the world politically and economically.

Similar Procedure on Argentina

A similar procedure on Argentina unquestionably will be applied to that country, Villarroel said. A regime was set up last June, it is found that Argentine influence was instrumental in bringing about the overthrow of the old government in Bolivia.

Even without such evidence the methods applied to Bolivia may be used in the case of Argentina, he said. Diplomatic relations with Argentina, he said, would be broken off, and the only one in this hemisphere maintaining a policy of neutrality toward the Axis powers.

Chilean officials only last month refused to grant visas to Argentine and Bolivian delegates to the North Carolina delegation to the Democratic National Convention and indicated that the south would not be regarded as significant.

Urges Walker Start Action

Vandenberg Asks Democrats to Eliminate Foreign Policy Issue.

Washington, Jan. 7.—(AP)—Senator Vandenberg (R-Mich.) today challenged Democratic National Chairman Frank Walker to take the initiative in accepting what the senator called a four-month-old invitation of Republicans to eliminate the foreign policy issue from the presidential campaign.

Vandenberg told a reporter that Walker's statement in an interview yesterday that the important thing for this country now is "to adopt an international policy that is worthwhile and plan for the peace" ought to be followed by action on the part of the Democrats.

"It would be very interesting if Mr. Walker would implement his wishful thinking by indicating where, when and how the Democratic party either has spoken as definitely on foreign policy as the Republicans did at Mackinac, or whether he or it has or will move to accept the invitation extended to him there last September," the Michigan senator declared.

Party Support Pledged

Vandenberg alluded to a foreign policy resolution adopted by a committee he headed and subsequently ratified by the Republican Post-War Advisory Council, pledging the party to support "responsible participation in the United States in post-war cooperative organization among sovereign nations to prevent military aggression and to attain permanent peace, with organized justice in a free world."

Vandenberg added attention to the fact that the resolution concluded with an invitation to "all Americans to adhere to the principles here set forth to the end that our place among the nations of the world and our part in helping to

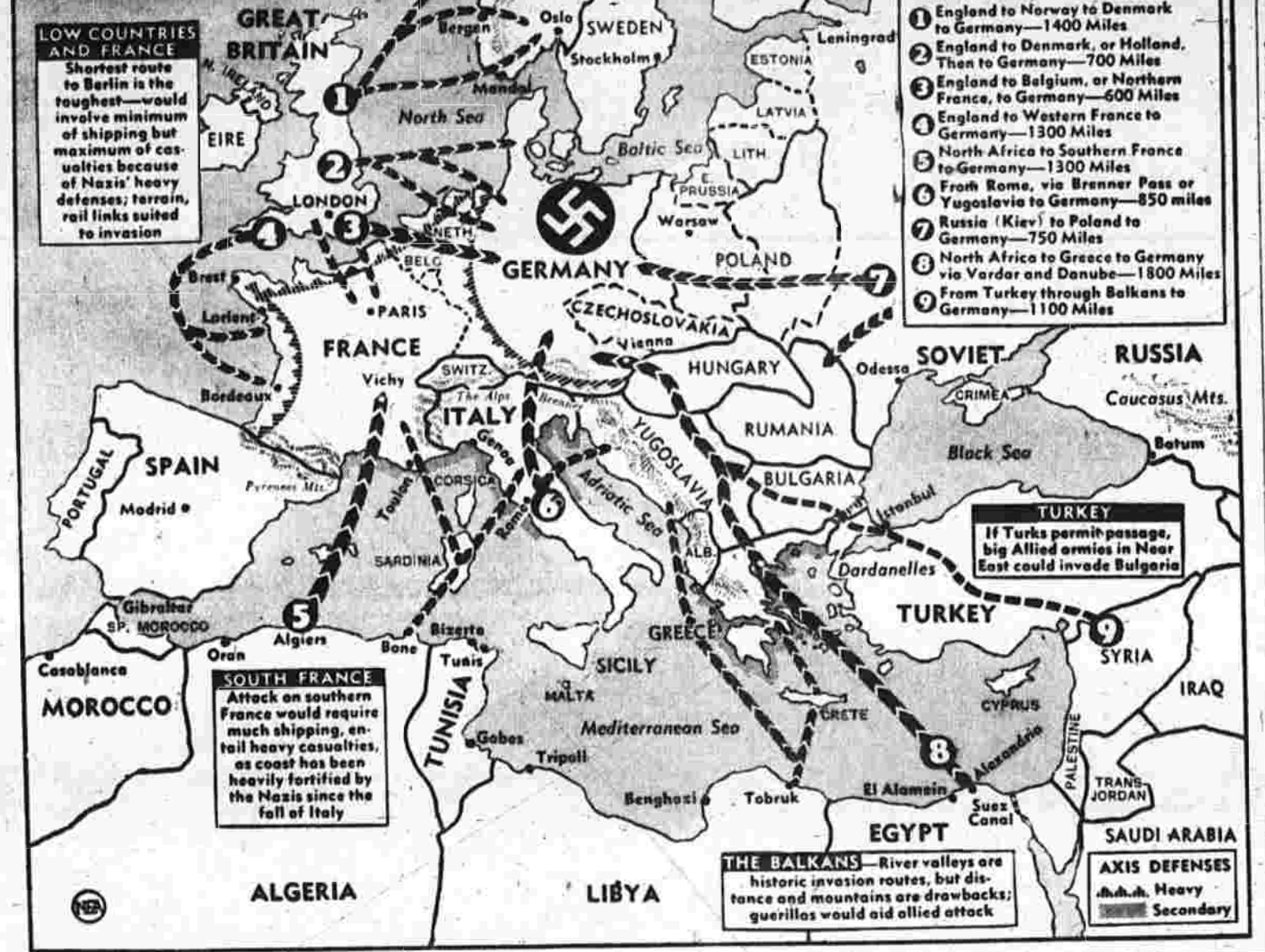
