**Your Federal Income Tax**  
 No. 7  
 Income of Minors  
 A minor who receives income (a) from property held in trust for him or (b) from funds held in trust for him or (c) from earnings which belong to him must file an annual income tax return for the year in which the total income for the year is \$500 or more.  
 A minor in one who has not yet reached full legal age. In some States both male and female come of age, or reach the age of majority, at the age of 21 years, while in other States men become of age at 21 and women at 18 years of age. It is the law generally that during the minority of a child his services and earnings do not belong to him, but to his parents, who are under a legal duty to support him and have a legal right to his earnings. In the absence of evidence to the contrary, therefore, it is presumed, for income tax purposes, that a parent has the legal right to the earnings of a minor and, accordingly, the parent must report such earnings on his own return. This is especially the case if he claims a credit for dependent or status as a head of a family with respect to the support of the minor, for that fact would be evidence that the parent was under a legal duty to support the child. Such circumstances, the parent is entitled to take credit for his return for any income and victory taxes that have been withheld at the source of the earnings. If, however, a parent has relinquished his legal duty to support the child and has relinquished the control and later joined the child by conferring on the latter the ownership of the property, the child is taxable on his own earnings. The efforts of such "locusts" are with the obligation of self-supporting the minor and the income tax on his own earnings. Such relinquishment of rights, or emancipation, may be effected, as by voluntary agreement of parent and child, or by a court order, but remains the right to control the social or moral conduct of the minor. In any case where the parent retains the right to control the child and the child is not taxable on his own earnings, the parent is liable for the tax on the child's earnings. The facts in each case will determine whether the earnings of the minor must be reported in the return of the minor or of his parent.
