





Virtually Seals Fate
Capture of the key rail junction of Apostolovo, 34 miles west of Nikopel, by troops of Gen. Rodion Y. Malinevsky's Third Ukrainian army virtually sealed the fate of the five Nikopel divisions. It climaxed a four-day drive from the northeast which ripped 37 miles through the German lines on a 100-mile-long front between Nikopel and Krivei Rog to occupy Marganets, a town less than 10 miles northeast of Nikopel.

Seven Nazi divisions were routed, a Russian communique said. The enemy abandoned tremendous quantities of war equipment besides leaving 12,000 dead on the battlefield. Two thousand more yere captured as Malinovsky's infantry and tanks, covered by fisets of low-flying Stormovik dive-bombers, rolled forward, liberating 250 towns and villages.
