Would Simplify Tax Structure

George Proposes Committees Work Together On Streamlining Plans

Washington, Feb. 8.—(AP)—Chairman George (D-Ga.) of the Senate Finance committee proposed today that Senate and House committees work together on early simplification and streamlining of the income tax structure.

George said he believed approximately 50,000,000 of the 60,000,000 taxpayers could be spared the need of filing any returns at all beginning in 1945 by making their final tax obligation the withholding levy against their wages and salaries.

Meanwhile, Republican members of the tax-drafting House Ways and Means committee issued a statement demanding immediate action, and Chairman Doughton (D-N.C.) called the committee together today for a preliminary discussion of the possibilities of shedding some of the red tape out of the tax laws.

Senate's Joint Committee on Taxation, which has been studying the problem since 1937, suggested a joint committee made up of members of the Senate Finance and the House Ways and Means groups attack the simplification job, holding hearings, and then report back to their respective committees.

The House group has before it a suggestion by Representative Robertson (D-Wa.) that, as a quick cure for some of the current confusion, the Treasury arrange to

Rotarians and Guests At "Ladies' Night" Enjoy Fun on Art.

Ladies' Night of the Rotary club at the Y.M.C.A. banquet hall last night was an enjoyable occasion brought out by a goodly attendance of the members' wives and guests. She gave a number of amusing instances of her life in Poland, and told the scholars at Warsaw Academy trying to paint the interesting mountain scenes in their colorful garb. They are called "Polish Beauties" and when they were discovered in the city, the young artists would eagerly set up their easels and try to paint the quaint figures. However, when the students discovered they would literally "take to their heels," Mrs. Hill entered a picture of one of these peasants at one of the exhibits held several years ago by Rev. J. M. Hill in St. Mary's parish house, and it created no little interest. She executed some of the murals in the trade school corridor, and has taught private scholars and sketches in her spare time. She remarked last night that there are many people in Manchester who are talented along this line and she believed an Art Club would do much to advance here.

Mrs. Hill was pleased with questions at the close of her lecture, which was greeted with a hearty round of applause.

New Rutabaga Called Storrs

Improvement of Pole Lima Bean Variety by Dr. Porter Announced

Storrs, Feb. 8.—(AP)—Development of a new variety of rutabaga and an improvement of a pole lima bean variety were reported today by Dr. A. M. Porter, associate professor of vegetable gardening at the University of Connecticut.

Seeking a rutabaga that would meet the competition of the northern-grown vegetable shipped into the state in large quantities each year, Dr. Porter has developed a variety of rutabaga, the name of Storrs. A mild flavored, yellow rutabaga that cooks up medium yellow in color, garden trials show it to be fast growing, tender, fine grained and suitable for either commercial or home garden production.

Commercial seedsmen who grew the Storrs rutabaga in trial plots last year were particularly impressed with its quality. It is a cross between two American strains of the Long Island type, and a popular English variety.

Dr. Porter's improved pole lima bean variety is the Silesia Whipple, originated by the late Siles Whipple of Norwich, a plant breeder who developed the well-known golden yellow sweet corn bearing his name. Securing seeds from Dr. Porter has selected it for uniformity of size and it is a long-season variety, producing large, meaty, tender beans.

Dr. Porter began the breeding work for these varieties at Storrs for the new Coventry tomato, recently announced. Several other new varieties of vegetables are available in limited quantities for home gardeners or commercial growers who wish to try them. Requests for trial packages should be sent to him at the University of Connecticut, Storrs.

Program for Avoiding Pneumonia Is Offered

Hartford, Feb. 9.—(P)—A five-point program for avoiding pneumonia has been offered by Epidemiologist James C. Hart of the State Health Department, who declared that Connecticut's recent outbreak of mild influenza had been followed by an increase in other respiratory diseases.

Dr. Hart declared that hospital records have disclosed that 60 to 80 per cent of patients suffering from pneumonia had had some sort of upper respiratory infection previously.

Dr. Hart's anti-pneumonia program means that:

1. If you have a cold or other respiratory illness, stay at home to avoid spreading germs.
2. Destroy all discharges from a diseasable tissue or handkerchief and destroy all discharges from the nose and throat.
3. Do not try to work off a cold by exercise as this will only increase fatigue and make you more susceptible.
4. Do not take the time-honored treatment of a cold or early pneumonia by a large dose of liquor as this does more harm than good.
5. If fever is present, go to bed and call a physician, he can help prevent pneumonia or, if it has already started, he can cure it by the use of medicines at his hospital.
