

Buggestions of Committee

Here are the suggestions upon which the committee wants Congress to act:

It should draw up the rules and regulations, oversee the entire job and issue directives under which and issue directives under which are lightly the procurement agencies, such

as the War and Navy departsuitable for peacetime production should be sold where this can be should be sold where this can be done without ruinous over-production in any industry, creating monopolies, or aiding monopolies already in existence.

Speed and fairness in settling contracts should not be sacrificed in an effort to detect fraud prior to settlement of claims against the government.

Would Be Liable to Penalty
But there should be machinery to detect and punish fraud. Any contractor overstating his claim would be liable to a penalty of 1 per cent a month until repayment.

Company records—to provide for a complete audit in case of any fraud suspected later—should be kept for a specified time, with criminal penalties for failure to do so.

ernment and a contractor should not be subject to review by any independent agency, except

fraud.

Where the government and contractor can not agree, the contractor should be able to appeal to umpires appointed by the demobilization office in every judicial district or to a review board in Washington.

Unless previous arrangements have been made for their retention by the contractor, government-owned machinery, tools, equipment and inventories should be removed immediately from privately owned plants, even if this means moving them out into the weather for lack of storage facilities.

Favors Immediate Payment

of the direct cost of all inventories or raw waterials and partly
processed goods in the hands of
the contractor; and as much, up
to 90 per cent, of all other items






