

It has been my observation from close range that Japanese Army and Navy officers have tremendous respect for their emperor and imperial family, but they no longer hold them in the awe they officially profess and that experienced by their comrades of an earlier day. It's sharply open to question whether the more worldly-wise among them adhere to the widespread belief among their leaser kinsmen that their emperor is of divine origin. That myth was born of political rests there.

A hull continued in the fighting on the Cassino sector to the east. The Germans tried to infiltrate around Fifth Army outposts on two peaks northwest of the town, but withdrew under cover of a smoke screen when Allied artillery opened fire.
