# 'Forgiveness' Feature Adds to Tax Burden

Word with More Than One Meaning When Applied to Federal Income Tax Returns.

(Editor's Note: Here's the third of six daily columns designed to help you make through the income tax return.)

Washington, Feb. 23.—(AP)—"Forgiveness" is a word with more than one meaning when applied to the Federal income tax.

Congress argued a long time about "forgiving" part of the year's taxes in order to get a pay-as-you-go system started. But the final act was passed Feb. 22, not less, taxes this year—unless you entered the armed services in 1942 or 1943, in which case you may be entitled to a refund.

"Forgiveness" means that in the average civilian's case, in addition to one meaning when applied to the Federal income tax, it means that you may pay by March 15 one-half of your 1943 taxes, and the other half by March 15, 1944.

Remember, to begin with, that the 1943 income tax is based on your 1942 income tax liability.

Congress enacted this "forgiveness" feature in 1942, when it was 50 percent or 500, whichever amount was larger, of the 1942 tax liability (1943 or 1942) is canceled.

That's assume for the moment that your 1943 taxes are larger than your 1942 taxes.

If your 1943 taxes are \$50 or less, it's canceled.

Two Officers and Ship's Cook Decorated at New London Base.

U. S. Submarine Base, Groton, Conn., Feb. 23.—(AP)—A Navy commander and Lieutenant commander, both of them submarine skippers, and a ship's cook, third class, were decorated here yesterday for heroic action.

Comdr. Cyrus R. Donaho, of New London, son of Mr. and Mrs. C. R. Donaho of Groton, Tex., and Lieut. Comdr. Merrill K. Clementson, of North Stonington, son of Mrs. Clyde Kelly of 3700 Adams street in Waterbury, and Paquette Cicchetti, owner of the establishment and joint respondent, were decorated here yesterday.

Cicchetti was given a seven-month suspension from Feb. 23, 1942, for neglecting his duties as skipper of the submarine U. S. S. Nautilus. He was ordered to suspend his pay for five months. Commutation of two months of the sentence was ordered in each case provided the man is in complete compliance with PA rules and regulations.

Cicchetti was held less involved by the commissioner since, although he was a member of the establishment, he attended the pumps only during periods of his employer's relief.

The awards were made by Rear Admiral Frelund A. Dabbin, commander submarines, Atlantic fleet.
