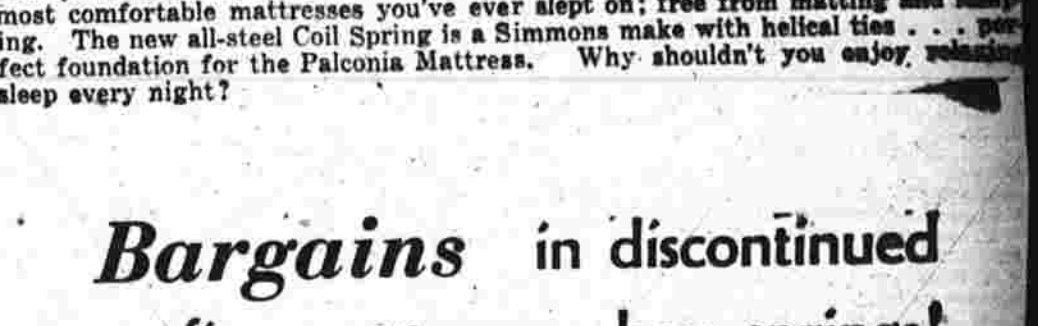

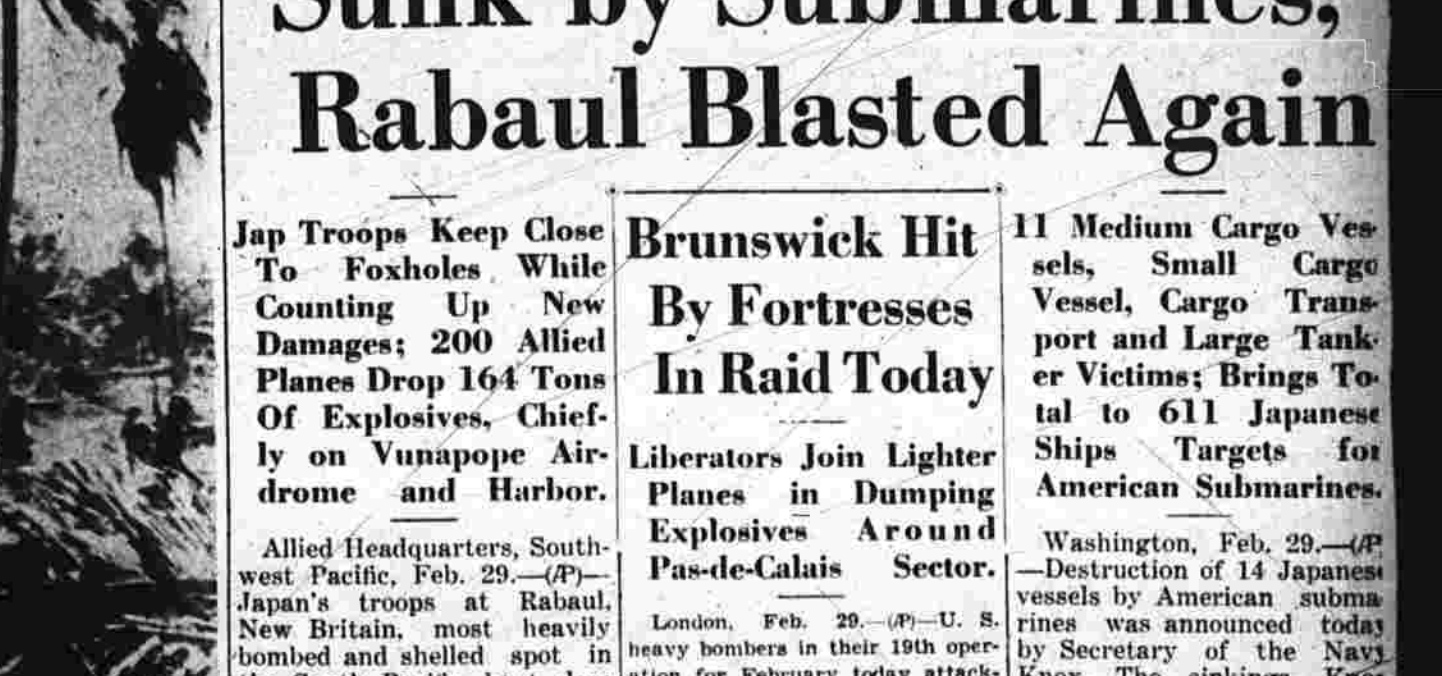
**Red Drive Threatens Nazis in Northwest**
