Federal Ballot Plan Is Ready

Senate-House Conferees Leave Proposal on Doorstep of States.

Washington, March 1.—(AP)—Senate-House conferees dressed up an armistice service Federal ballot plan today, and left it on the doorstep of the states.

The compromise-Federal ballot for the armed forces only, the states agree to their use—was born after more than two weeks of argument, but neither side seemed anxious to claim it for its own.

"I'm afraid I'll scolded Representative Franklin (D-Minn.) outside of my Federal voting by any means."

"I doubt very much whether it is entirely acceptable to any of us," said Senator Green (D-Ill.), co-author of the original Federal ballot bill which took such a beating in the Senate and House that it all but died.

Provisions of New Plan

The new plan, sent on its way toward Senate and House floors where conferees' compromise are usually accepted, provides:

1. A Federally distributed short-form ballot for the armed forces to vote for president, vice president and members of Congress.
2. It can be used by voters of states which have their own absentee ballot machinery only if the governors certify before August 1 that the Federal form is acceptable under state law.
3. Voters from states which have no absentee voting law can use the Federal form only if the governor certifies that it will be welcomed as a bona fide vote.
4. No servicemen or women can get a Federal ballot unless the state has applied for a state ballot and awaits it from the federal government by Oct. 1.

Main Loses Fence Case

State's Highest Tribunal Rules Against North Stonington Farmer.

Hartford, March 1.—(AP)—Lafayette E. Main, North Stonington farmer, lost today a score of property and past state legislators, has another day in court and lost.

This time Squire "Lafe" went to the state supreme court in an attempt to collect damages in a dispute over a fence. But the state's highest tribunal ruled against him in a unanimous opinion made public today.

"Lafe" has frequently asserted that "every man is entitled to his day in court," and practices what he preaches. One of his principal delights is to make his many courtroom experiences, usually as a litigant in cases involving his extensive property holdings in North Stonington, Leyard and Preston.

Many of those stories he has told before legislative committees at the state Capitol where years he has sponsored several bills which have required lawyers to advise innocent persons to plead guilty or the one prohibiting a motorist from blowing a horn on a highway when approaching any living object.

As a lawyer, Main has noted that Main, who is close to 70 years of age, appeared "pro se," which means he was his own lawyer as he has been in many other cases.

Main's characteristic of Main, a few years ago when the Legislature passed a law requiring all lobbyists to register, "Lafe" strode into the office of the secretary of the state and wrote: "Lobbyist for myself."

In his latest court battle, "Lafe" referred to the Court of Common Pleas in New London county in an effort to collect damages from Hibbard R. Norman, administrator for the estate of Thomas E. Hewitt. Main contended that since Hewitt's death in 1921, the latter's estate had failed of a fence separating property owned by the estate and Main. As a result, Main contended, he had been deprived of income from his land and had lost a large number of sheep.

Common Pleas Judge John T. Callahan directed a verdict against Main and today's opinion upheld the decision.

Death Takes Noted Editor

Sidney W. Challenger 25 Years Grand Treasurer for Odd Fellows.

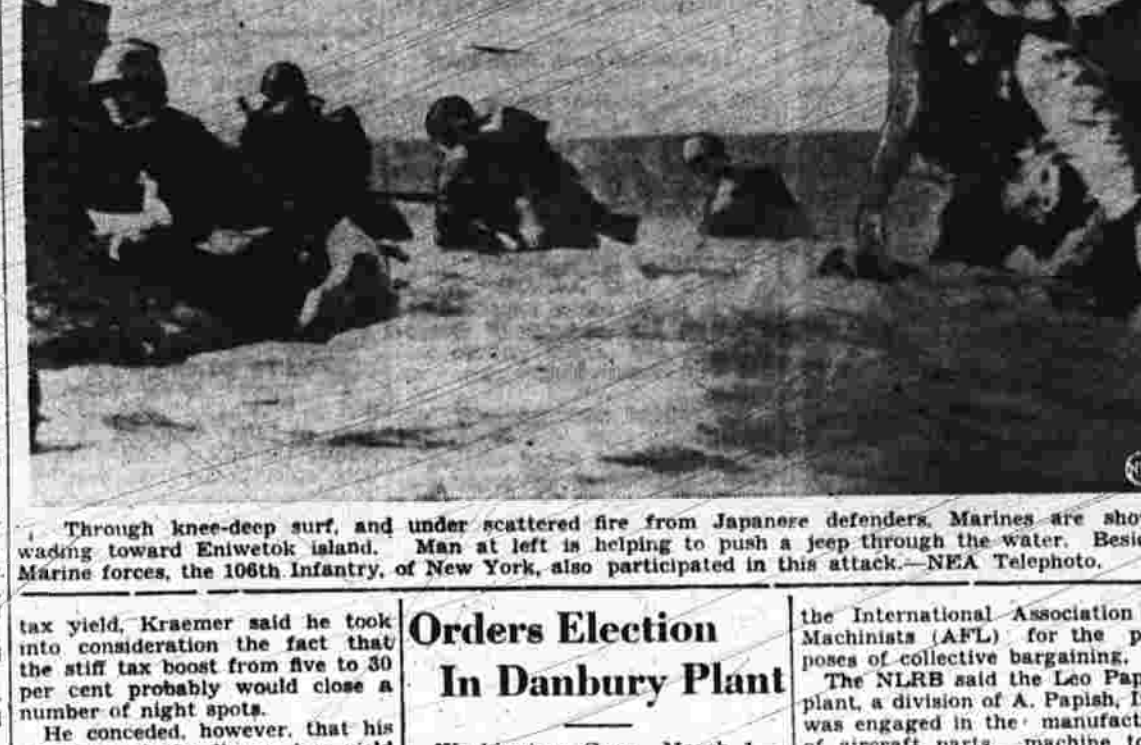
