### Absentee Vote Bill Is Ready

#### Divided Group of Senate and House Conferees Offer Measure.

Washington, March 3.—A servicemen's absentee vote bill compounded from a state rights formula with just a touch of Federal jurisdiction was served up to Congress today by a divided group of Senate and House conferees.

Heavily emphasizing priority for the states in providing full voting privileges for their citizens serving in the armed forces, the bill would make a curtailed Federal ballot available only as a last resort under sharply restricted conditions.

First, the applicant would have to be serving outside the continental United States and would have to apply for a state ballot before Sept. 1.

Further, to obtain the Federal "war ballot," he would have to certify he had not received the state ballot form by Oct. 1. Even then, he would be eligible for the Federal form only if the governor of his state had certified by Aug. 1 that the Federal ballot was authorized by state laws.

Supported by House Group Senator Green (D. R. I.), chairman of the Senate conferees and sponsor of a full Federal ballot bill voted against the compromise plan, calling it even more restricted than the existing absentee vote law adopted in 1942, Senator Hatch (D. N. M.), also voted against the revised bill, which was supported by the three other Senate conferees and by the entire House group.

The Federal ballot would be handled by a commission composed of the secretaries of war and navy and the War Shipping administrator. Blanks on the form would enable the soldier or sailor to write in his choice for President, senator and representative in Congress only.

Whether the votes would be counted would depend on the action of the states. For that reason alone, the final form of the bill represented a major victory for the "states rights" advocates.

The Senate will act first on the measure, probably next week.

### Disunity Seen In Democrats

#### Willkie Says 'Party Is Falling to Pieces' in Address Over Radio.

New York, March 3.—"The Democratic party is falling to pieces and that President Roosevelt has lost his power to produce within the Democratic party a concerted and unified effort towards winning the war or planning for the peace."

In his first nationwide radio address since announcing his candidacy for the Republican presidential nomination, Willkie said last night that "the party which will win the election must have arrived at a strong and definite unity" by convention this year.

He spoke on the March of Time program over NBC.

"We Republicans must forget the growing pains of our recent past and concentrate on making our party an efficient, unified organization," he said, "not because the opportunity is now ours to step into power in the national government. We must, because never in the history of the United States has there been a more urgent and imperative need for a unified and efficient administration."

"Torn by disunity," Willkie said, "is torn by disunity."

"The Democratic party, which said it was 'torn by disunity,'" he said, "is becoming involved in deeply disturbing dissensions. Its executive leadership is becoming increasingly petty and arrogant in its relationship to Congress; the antagonistic social, economic and political groups that compose it have begun to war among themselves; the chief executive has lost his power to hold them together to direct them."

"Of course, he and other factional leaders of the Democratic party will try to smooth over the surface of their disunity. They will have to try to make it appear to the American people that there is unity, concord and effective cooperation within the party, if they expect to be re-elected."

Willkie said that "no patching job, however skillful, can last for long" and that should the Democrats win in November, "the disruptive forces within the party will split it wide open once again and the American people will be saddled with a hamstringing, stalemated and ineffective national government."

### Seeking to Solve Decline in Births


London, March 3.—A Royal commission set out today to study a solution to Great Britain's declining birth rate, described officially as "one of the most serious anxieties of the times."

In its search for the answers the commission expected to interview a representative number of women who have been married since 1918, when the decline in the birth rate began.


More children were born in 1942 than in any year since 1918, statistics show, but a commission member said that this was just a wartime development and is no indication that the real problem has been solved.

GLIDERS—destined to carry airborne units over walls of Hitler's European Fortresses.




TANKS—Sherman tanks and tank destroyers, row on row, in England, awaiting invasion orders.

### Acquitted Man Badly Wounded

Chicago, March 3.—John J. Williams, one of three men acquitted last December on a charge of murdering Martin (Sonny) Boy Quirk, in a gangland war for control of gambling on the South Side, was shot and seriously wounded today as he drove alone in his automobile on a South Side street.

At the Holy Cross hospital, where physicians attempted to re-attach his right arm, his body, Williams declined to discuss the shooting. Policemen Edward Schvenc and Frank O'Farrell said Williams, 30-year-old gambler and tavern operator, when asked to name his assailants, replied: "Santa Claus."

Some lawyers have been sitting up nights trying to figure out how lawyers can use simple English.

Now a committee of 18 appointed by the Supreme court has an idea which doesn't go so far as it might, maybe, but it still an idea.

Dress Up Book of Rules  
The committee has drawn up a book of rules for simplifying criminal procedure in federal courts. The book is almost entirely about rules.

But at one place the committee takes a poke at the way lawyers write. This is on the subject of writing indictments.

This is how the committee suggests writing an indictment against a man who shot another to death on government property: "The grand jury charges: On or about the day of... in the district of... and on lands acquired for the use of the United States and under exclusive jurisdiction of the United States, John Doe with premeditation shot and murdered Richard Doe."

Now with a little more work even that recommended form might be pulled together a little better but it's a big improvement over a lot of indictments being written now.

Here's a sample of that type, given by the committee as a horrible example, running to more than 600 words. We've cut pieces out of it here and there to shorten it, particularly the first 250 words which explain the date, location and the fact that the property was owned by the government.
