The Penglope was lost with the cruiser Spartan and the destroyers Janus and Inglefield in the establishment and maintenance of the Nettuno bridgehead in Italy, Commons was informed by A. V. Alexander, first lord of the Admiralty. Loss of the other vessels was announced previously. Five major assault vessels also were bridgehead casualties, Alexander said.

The Penglope survived 14 days of hombing in Malita's grand harbor during the height of the Axia campaign against the Mediterranean island bastion.

On the way to Gibraltar she underwent three more days of attack, during which 14 torpedoes and 3,000 tons of bombs were aimed at her by German and Italian planes.

In a 24-day period her own guns fired 35,000 five-inch shells, 20,000 two-pounders and 8,000 cerilkon shells.
