Dr. James G. Gilkey to Give Talk Before Educational Club. Dr. James Gordon Gilkey, well known preacher from Springfield, will speak at the Educational Club at its meeting Wednesday, March 14, at eight o'clock at the Hollister street school. At this time Dr. Gilkey will show color films entitled "Yosemite National Park," which he photographed on a recent trip through the west. The film begins with several pictures of the Indians at Acoma Pueblo, near Albuquerque, New Mexico. There are unusual views of Boulder Dam, some of them taken from a boat on Lake Mead, the artificial lake formed by the dam.

The first long sequence of the film shows across the Yosemite National Park. This is followed by pictures of the redwood forests north of San Francisco, and then a long sequence made at Crater Lake, Oregon. Only color photography makes it possible to record accurately the most incredible blue of this lake, located 6,000 feet above sea level in the crater of an extinct volcano. From here the film progresses to Mt. Ranier where the snow and clear blue sky provide a Swiss-alpine like background. The climax of the film is the section devoted to the Canadian Rockies, where among other things, the film shows the Bow River, Emerald Lake, Moraine Lake, the John Valley, Takahew Falls, and Lake Louise.

It's Our Turn to Build for Tomorrow. My wife and I think we are doing our "bit" right now to get this war over as quickly as possible. We want to get living again... me on my old job and my wife cooking and keeping house. We've been on our war jobs every day for seven months and only late twice in the past year. What's more, our production has been going up, too, every month.

But I'm worried. I hear a lot of companies in some parts of Connecticut can't get any more war contracts because the government says they are in a "No. 1 Critical Labor Area." That means there aren't as many available workers in that territory as the factories ask for. And what's worse still, Uncle Sam, being in a rush for the goods, doesn't want to give new work to any factory that happens to be in a No. 1 Area if he can get some other company in a non-critical area to do it.

Although my boss tells me I don't need to worry about running short of work, I'm worried about some other shops that give us a lot of business in peacetime. They've got to be kept going. If their "home towns" don't get out of "No. 1 Critical Labor Area" soon they may be forced to slow down or shut down. Then where will they get the money to produce the peacetime gadgets my company makes parts for?

It's serious business this fighting in Europe and in the Pacific for the right to work where you please. It's equally serious working right here at home for the same thing. We're all in the struggle together. We win, lose or draw. We've got to give up more men from the factories to do the big fighting this spring and summer... maybe next summer too, and the one after that. At the same time we've got to produce more at home with less men to back up the boys "over there." If we produce more per man we can't give out the "critical labor areas" here. Contracting will continue, then our factories will have the money to give peacetime jobs quickly after the war is over.

The old-timers built the foundations of our prosperity. It's our turn to build 'em now, "double thick"—one layer to boost over the Axis and the other to build on "when the war is won." There's only one way to do it. We've got to work together with management and do "BETTER THAN THE BEST" we've ever done before.
