Enter Claims For Exemption

Tax Collector Nelson Asks Information on Our Service Men

Parents or relatives of men who have entered the service in recent months are requested by Tax Collector Nelson to report at the tax collector's office to sign the necessary papers to secure the \$1,000 tax exemption granted by the State at the last session of the General Assembly.

The Best Procedure Tax Collector Nelson feels that a person who is the best means of establishing the exemption claim is to make a statement as to the date of induction of the serviceman.

As in the case of the list of men who entered the service yesterday morning, each man is entitled to an exemption of \$1,000 in taxable property, or \$200 in the 1944 tax rate, or \$100 in the 1945 rate of the family may give this information to the collector.

After April 15 this year, the due date of the 1944 taxes, no man who enters the service after that date may receive exemption on the current tax, but on the other hand any man who was inducted after April 15, 1943 is entitled to an exemption of the 1944 tax payable April 15 this year, of \$1,000.

A large list of tax eligibles now in service are in the tax office and held in suspense and awaiting the report of parents or relatives on their induction date before exemption can be granted.
