YOUR VICTORY GARDEN

By Robert Geiger

Part 13: The weapons of war, a Victory Garden general's implements need be neither formidable nor intricate.

About all he needs is a good spade, a rake, a hoe, a stout piece of cord, stakes, a sharp sickle and a spray duster.

If the ground can be plowed by tractor or horse, by all means have the work done that way. It not only saves hand work, but placing plants the soil in better condition than spading.

If the soil is shallow, avoid deep tilling or plowing.

Every gardener should have a good spade or a spading fork regardless of whether the soil is spaded or plowed at the start.

He also should have a good strong rake because the ground after spading or plowing must be worked thoroughly with the rake. If enough space is left between rows, the rake also can be used as a cultivator when it is necessary to do a quick job.

A stout hoe is necessary for making the planting furrows, the irrigation ditches and for cultivating.

The cord and stakes are used in making the planting furrows. This assures a neat, attractive garden and in addition it saves labor because straight, well-laid-out gardens are easier to cultivate and water.

The sharply pointed stick is used to make the small holes in the ground in which large seeds are planted.

Small dusting guns also may be obtained in seed stores and are used for dusting powdered poisons upon plants.

The spray and some of the more elaborate gardening tools, like wheel cultivators, may be purchased by gardening clubs of communities.

Because of the fact that these tools may be available this season, both gardeners and non-gardeners may be grown without them.

Comment From The River Road

Mr. Mollan, retired editor of The Herald, preserves his contact with his former daily readers by writing a weekly letter for their coverage of the invasion.

Anyhow, I see by Newswatch that the radio systems are all set for their coverage of the invasion.

Stony Brook tumbles into our two to one, for the whole cover, at the very head of the last week, that the Anglo-American invasion of western Europe would not be launched this spring, or even before the end of summer.

It does me to hazard absolutely, I do not know to the extent of one hundred thousand. But wild horses, or even wilder taunts, wouldn't induce me to hazard absolutely, I do not know to the extent of one hundred thousand.

That's because I have become convinced that there is a simple, inescapable belief in some well impregnable British quarters that the Germans can be beaten into submission from the air.

It is something in the way of posterity that J. Kenneth is also a pleasant fellow, in fact, who ever held the post of state chairman.

Moreover, Stony Brook stands out among other trout streams of the British Isles, in my mind, as being the water from which my wife, in her first season as an angler, took the biggest speckled trout either of us has ever caught; it weighed two pounds on the scales at Bill Hendrickson's roadside grocery store.

All of which leads up to the fact that year before last I took a good care to go to the Waterford Hall of Records and get myself one of those bargain price fishing licenses which the state of Connecticut provides for old codgers for 25 cents on the principle, I suppose, that the sorely stricken years won't catch any fish any more.

I was now going to have a week or two at Stony Brook again, if it was only to teach a worm-to swim. And then I never wet a line in the brook—or in any other trout water, for that matter. Again last year I did the same thing. And still I don't know whether the brook is fishable, or whether the hurricane of '38 wrecked it as angling water.

But I am firmly resolved to go get a license again this spring and, heaven and earth permitting, to at least once—and for at least fifteen minutes—experiment with a sithery night crawler or a bunch of garden worms under a blob of cream colored foam staked against a fallen tree trunk where the water runs darkly on the deep side of the brook part as overabundant cutbank.

If my wife and I can get two trout each, anywhere upward of eight inches long, we shall figure that we have achieved greatly.
