London, April 3.—(AP)—A great formation of American heavy bombers attacked Budapest today, carrying out the first U. S. attack on the Hungarian capital. The bombers flew from bases in Italy, and the Berlin radio told of violent battles between American and German planes over Hungary.

Railway Center Target The Budapest railway center and an important aircraft factory just south of the capital were the targets of the 10th Air Force, a U. S. Air Force spokesman announced today. Budapest, one of Europe's most beautiful cities, is situated on the Danube. American and British bombers attacked it previously, but the Russian Air Force attacked it in September, 1943.

Labor Shifts Not as High As Year Ago 'Separation Rates' in Majority of 26 Industries Producing Munitions Show Decrease.

Washington, April 3.—(AP)—Labor "turnover," a condition often mentioned in arguments for a national service law, is not as bad in most munitions industries as it was a year ago, a report issued today by the War Relocation Authority shows. The report, based on a survey of 26 industries that produce munitions, shows that the "separation rates" in most of them have decreased since last year.

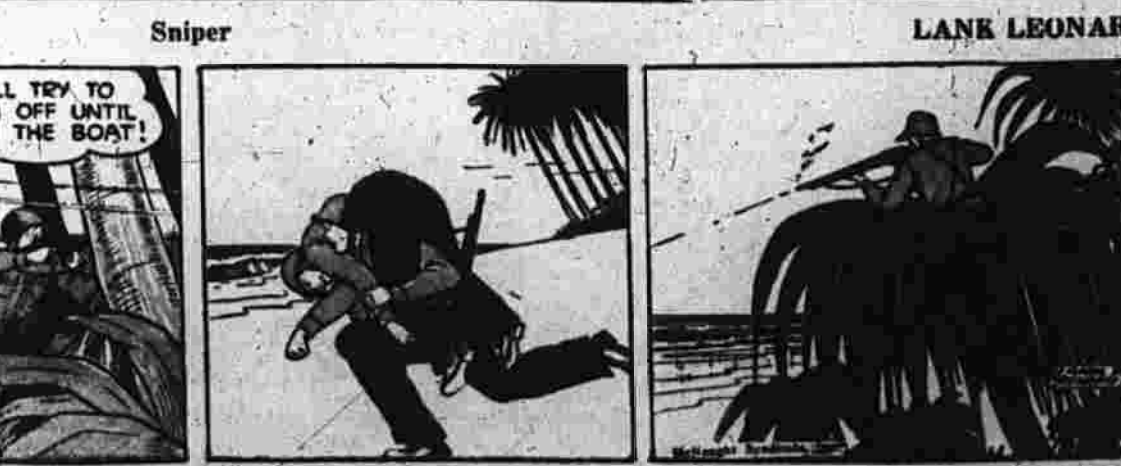

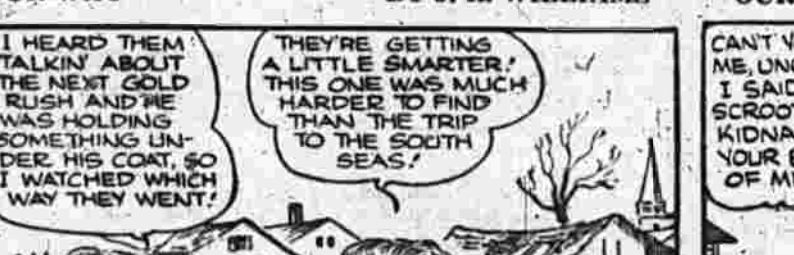
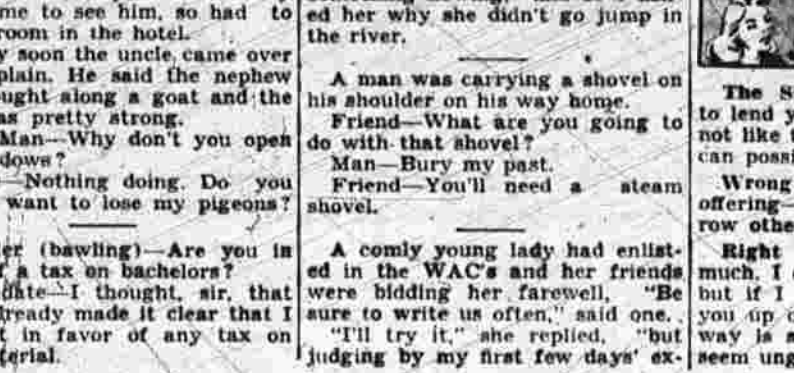
