Washington, April 4.—(AP)—American-born Japanese will vote this year, just like other Americans, but most of them will have to do it by absentee ballot.

The reason: So many of them are in relocation centers, outside the states where they live before Pearl Harbor, and were moved there by the government.

Under a general rule in common law, a person can vote only in a state to which he has been moved. In the case of Japanese in relocation centers outside their own states will have to use the absentee ballot.
