Turmoil Over Draft, Manpower Confusing

Newsmen Ask Questions Answered by Selective Service and Manpower Agency

By James Marlow and George Zelnick
Washington, April 3.—(AP)—A newspaperman whose job is following the news every day frankly writes that he is confused by the turmoil over manpower and the draft.

He listed some questions—which may be bothering others—and asked for some answers. Here are the questions, and the answers by Selective Service and the War Manpower Commission:

Q. How much are the boards behind on their calls for men?
A. The boards failed to fill their calls. One board in New York is behind by 10,000 and has been lagging that much since last October.

Q. Why is the armed force too small?
A. That figure has been set by the chiefs of staff for what they apparently consider good military reasons, and they are sticking to it.

Q. Do SS and WMC send policy statements to local boards?
A. SS does, but not WMC which no longer is connected with SS.

Q. Has the request for emphasis on men under 26 been sent to local boards and, if so, has it been specific enough?
A. SS says "yes" to both questions, pointing out that it is local boards a couple of weeks ago, President Roosevelt's call for a review of all occupational draft deferments.

Q. To state directors, a telegram March 24 which instructed: All men under 26 with industrial deferments were to be given immediate pre-industrial physical examinations and that all occupational deferments, agricultural and industrial, were to be reviewed but first of all those of men under 26.

Q. In local boards April 1, notice that the unit-boards of granting farm deferments was to be abandoned. The unit measure worked like this: A cow was one unit, two cows, two units. Any farm-deferred man was supposed to be counted on for a minimum of 16 units.

Q. Personally don't think there was anything too clear in all this on the subject of inducting men under 26. There certainly wasn't on the farm-deferred group. In that category, the men under 26 are not getting pre-industrial physicals.

Q. If there is such a shortage of manpower, why aren't men under 45 taken for limited service?
A. The Army doesn't want men in that age group. The theory is that they lack younger men's endurance. Mr. Charles Davidson, limited service all it needs from those under 38 who are classified as fit only for limited service.

Next to Michigan, which of the 48 states has the greatest percentage of population engaged in war work, Connecticut, with 48 per cent of its entire population, engaged in the home-front war effort, must challenge itself now for the most challenging impact of the war," predicted Willard B. Rogers, chairman of the Connecticut State Development Commission, at the anniversary dinner of the Exchange Club, in the Hotel Sheraton last evening.

Mr. Rogers outlined the above statement, in part, as follows:
"It was relatively easy for our manufacturers throughout the country to convert to war production because of the long history of government contracts, with adequate financing facilities, were available."
"Reconversion is a really different. It will be particularly difficult for the same thousand Connecticut smaller manufacturers who are without research facilities and who will have to enter the most highly competitive markets of all time. The job, however, is not insurmountable."

Air headquarters said an aircraft was lost on the operation, which encountered only meager flak and no aerial opposition. A few hours earlier R.A.F. bombers, flying from the first time in a week, returned from blasting German aircraft repair plants in France, France, less than 50 miles from Spain.

The targets were clearly seen in the moonlight and first reports indicate that the bombing was effective, the announcement said.

The flight represented a round-trip of at least 1,000 miles, but despite the length of the journey not one of the big bombers returned, the Air Ministry said.
