London, April 11.—(AP)—Two of the leading American aces in this theater, Maj. Walter Mahurin and Maj. Gerald Johnson, credited with 18 and 16 victories in action, both apparently lost on the same mission March 27.

The circumstances of their last flights were not disclosed officially, but both were in Col. Hubert Zunker's "Wolf Pack" Thunderbolt fighter group.

Mahurin, former clerk from Fort Wayne, Ind., was the third ranking U. S. ace in the European theater when he was lost, training Capt. Don S. Gentile, Paris, Ohio, and Capt. Robert S. Johnson, Lawrence, Okla., who at that time were tied with 22 kills each. Since that Gentile has claimed 30 planes with 27 so far confirmed, and Captain Johnson has bagged one additional.

In Same Fighter Group

Major Johnson, from Owenton, Ky., and Captain Johnson were in the same fighter group.

Thunderbolt fighters on March 27 secured heavy bombers on raids upon nine French airfields and the Tours railroad yards.

Mahurin, whose promotion from captain to major was announced March 22, flew 30 missions before his first plane. Three times, however, he scored trophies once over Europe.

Combat Experience Gained With British

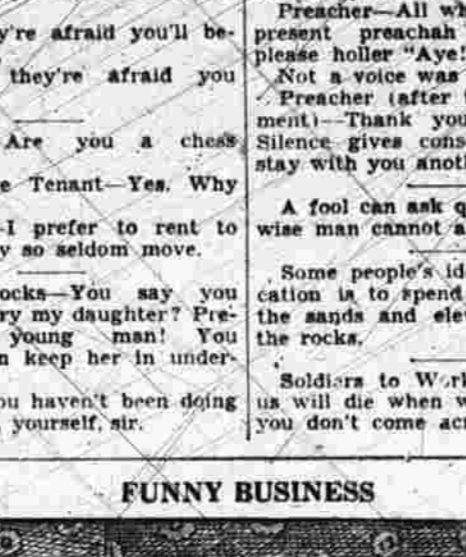

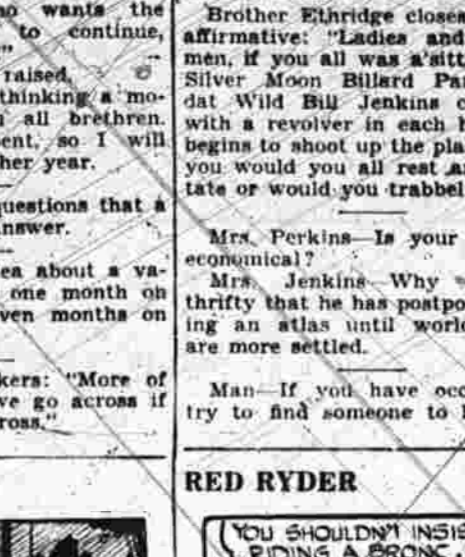

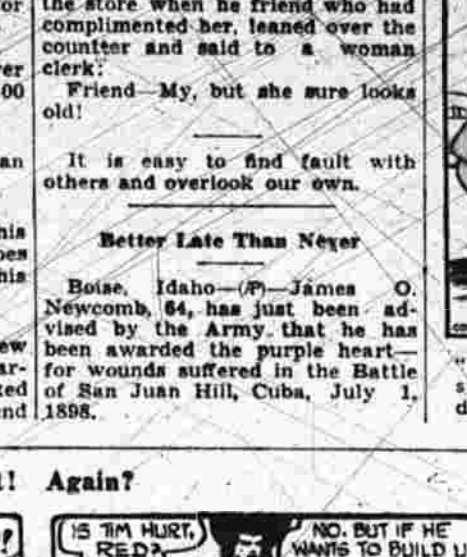

Italian King Will Give Son Power When Rome Won

Vittorio Emanuele Proclaims to People and World He Will Retire From Public Affairs Entirely on Day Allied Troops Enter Capital.

Naples, April 12.—(AP)—Tired and bereft of empire, King Vittorio Emanuele III proclaimed to his people and the world today that he would turn over the power of the throne to his six-foot son Umberto, 39, of Prince Piedmont on the day that Allied troops enter Rome.

The 74-year-old king would appoint his son "lieutenant-general of the realm," would receive entirely from public aid and that his decision was "final and irrevocable."

Yields Provisionally to Pressure This Vittorio Emanuele, whose reign began in 1900, yielded provisionally to the pressure of his people and his army when he refused to form a democratic government in Italy while he remained on the throne.

The "day shall come," said the king, "when I shall be able to abdicate and my people will be able to elect a free people among free nations."

Other representatives, who had called on the king, said that the only part the king had in this development was to sign the abdication document.

At loss to understand the necessity of such a trip at this time, Wallace said immediately that Wallace was being asked to absent himself so that another might be picked for second place on the Democratic ticket at the party convention in Chicago July 19.

49 Persons Known Dead; Storms Halt

Nearly 200 Injured in Tornadoes, Wind, Rain Squalls, Snow Storms From Rockies to Ocean

By The Associated Press Storms which battered most of the United States the past two days leaving 49 persons known dead today after a final tally in the eastern seaboard and the Great Lakes area.

Nearly 200 persons were injured in the tornadoes, rain squalls, wind storms and snow storms from the Rocky mountains to the Atlantic coast. Lighter rains extended west to California.

Many Remains Homeless Many remained homeless in Kansas and Oklahoma as rivers continued flooding in the west. A forecast of clearing and colder weather promised but not reached predicted crest.

Arkansas, with 35 dead in a series of tornadoes, was the worst sufferer. Six were killed in Fort Wayne, Ind., by a wall blown over.
