Highest Court Upholds Action

Interpretation of Dependency in Compensation Cases at Issue.

Hartford, April 18—(AP)—The Connecticut Supreme court, in a 3-2 decision today upheld a Superior court action in which an interpretation of dependency was the issue.

A compensation commission awarded \$10.00 a week to the parents of George Tsoulakas who was killed in January, 1943, while working for the Bolton Mfg. Co. of West Haven.

In its defense before the commission, the company contended that neither of the youth's parents were either partially or wholly dependent upon him for support within the meaning of the Workmen's Compensation Act. The commission overruled this claim and awarded the parents compensation of \$15.00 per week.

The Superior court, sustaining the company's appeal, struck out a finding that the father relied upon the money she received from them for the reasonable needs of the household and that the parents were dependent upon their son.

Counsel for the parents had moved unsuccessfully in Superior court to reopen the judgment and return the case to the commission for further consideration on the issue of dependency.

Housewives Urged To Use More Eggs

Not Abuse of Privilege
The majority opinion, written by Justice Brown in which Chief Justice Mather and Justice Ellis concurred held "the courts refused to remand the case did not constitute an abuse of its discretion."

Justice Jennings who dissented with Justice Dickenson, said "The Legislature has said that dependency is to be determined in accordance with the facts. The tribunal to decide this question is the trial of the fact, in this case, the commission. I think there was evidence in the record to support his finding and that the case should have been remanded with direction to dismiss the appeal."

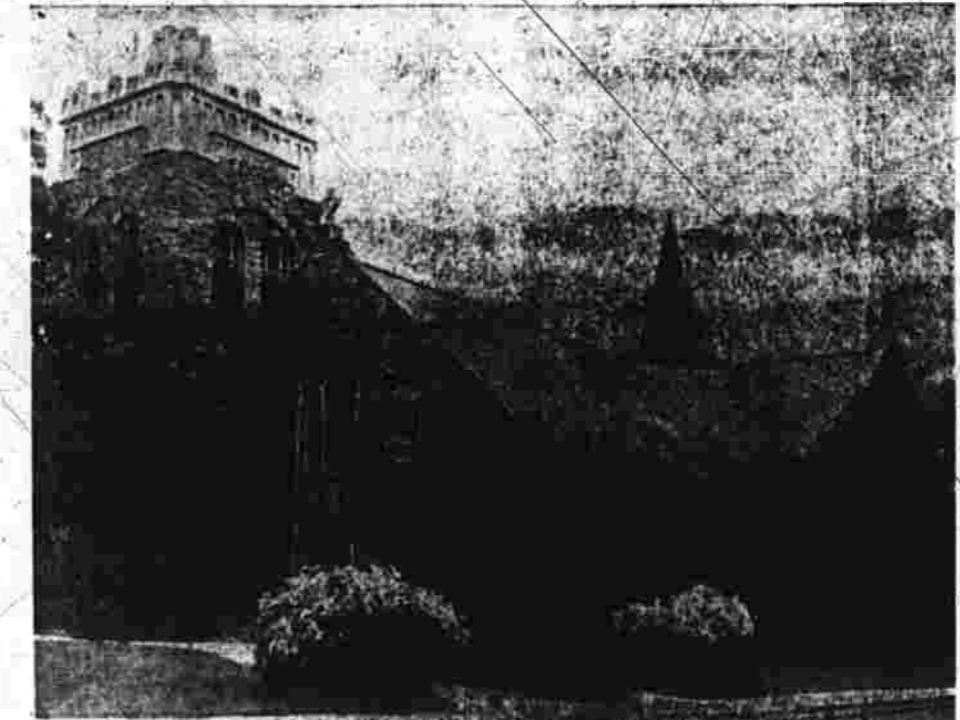

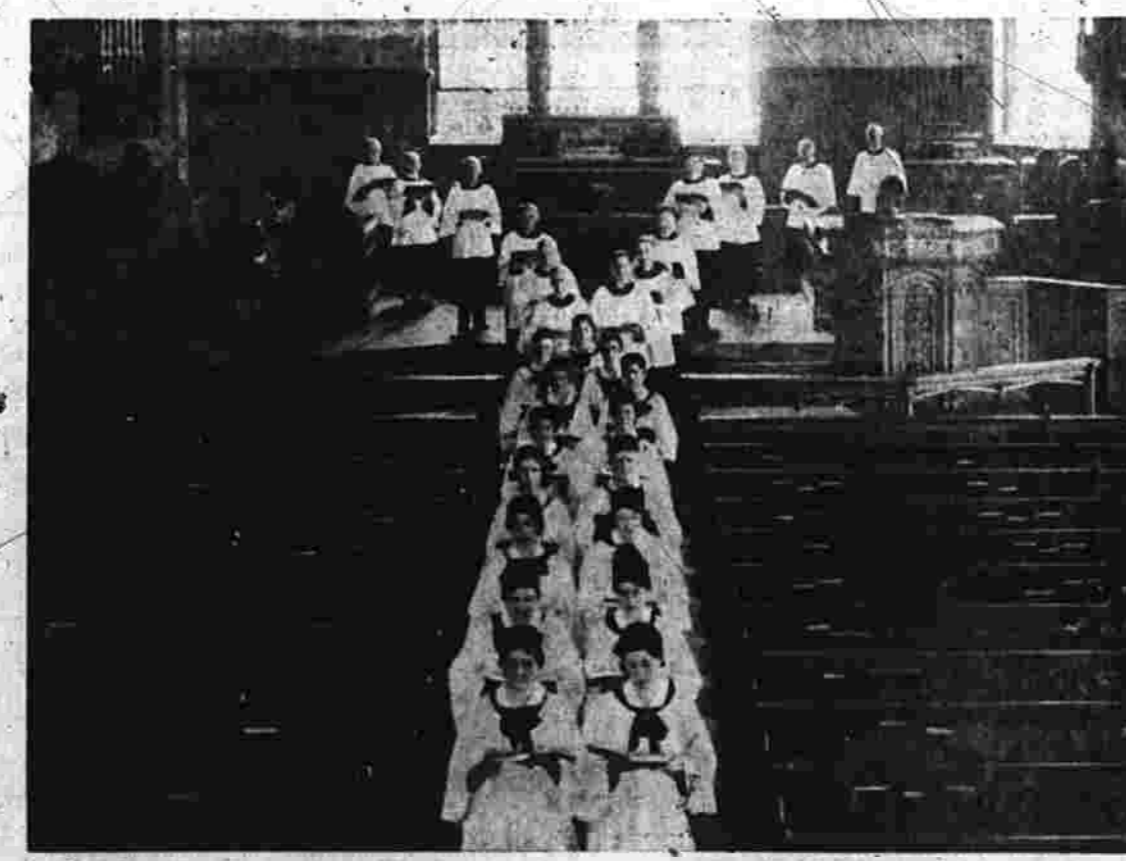
