The present design was adopted in 1904. A bronze five-pointed star, surrounded by a laurel wreath in green enamel, suspended by two red ribbons from a bronze bar bearing the inscription "Valor," and surmounted by an eagle. In the center of the star is the head of Minerva surrounded by the inscription "United States of America." Each ray of the star bears an oak leaf in green enamel.
