Troops Operating British Gas Works Manchester, England, April 21—
(AP)—British troops today took over the Manchester gas works, where 500 employes quit their jobs yesterday and left 220,000 consumers in the factory area without gas.

Technicians were dispatched to the plants to instruct the soldiers in their jobs and it was hoped the flow of gas would be resumed shortly. Munitions works, aircraft factories, mills and hospitals all were without gas in the city of factories, mills and hospitals all were without gas in the city of 766,000 population.

The gas employes walked out in a demonstration of dissatisfaction with a new say scale increasing the wages of day workers a penny (two cents) per hour and shift workers two pence. The strike was staged over the pleas of union leaders who urged the workers to stay on the job pending efforts to get a new contract.
