At Least 12,000 Have Been Dropped into Transit Fare Boxes.

New York, April 26.—(AP)—American transit companies are having super nightmares in which they dream that food rationing will come to an end suddenly, leaving approximately 2,000,000, 000 blue and red ration tokens in circulation.
