Top Navy Fighter Squadron, Flying Vought Corsairs, Loses No Bombers or Surface Vessels in 130 Escort Missions

SAN DIEGO, CALLE.-The U.S. Navy's first Corsair squadron, the Jolly Rogers, has come home from two tours of duty with the distinction of having shot down more enemy planes (154), than any other Navy or Marine fighter squadron. The Jolly Rogers squadron, which has also been called Skull and Crossbones Bearded Pirates and Blackburn's Irregulars, took a leading part in neutralizing Rabaul. On February 19, just before they left for home, the Jolly Rogers pilots sent 16 Zeros into the sea near Rabaul without losing a Corsair or pilot.
