Expect Swift Action on Tax

House Meets to Give Approval to Legislation Simplifying Statutes

Washington, May 7.—The taxpaying drama of a March 15 without fearful figures and dismal decimal points—again nearer to realization today. The House met to give overwhelming approval to legislation simplifying the tax statutes for 50,000,000 persons.

Leaders expected the measure to pass before midnight. It then will be sent to the Senate, where swift action also is expected.

Drawn by the House Ways and Means committee, the bill would relieve some 30,000,000 of the 50,000,000 taxpayers of the necessity of ever computing another income tax return, and simplify payment procedures for the 20,000,000 others.

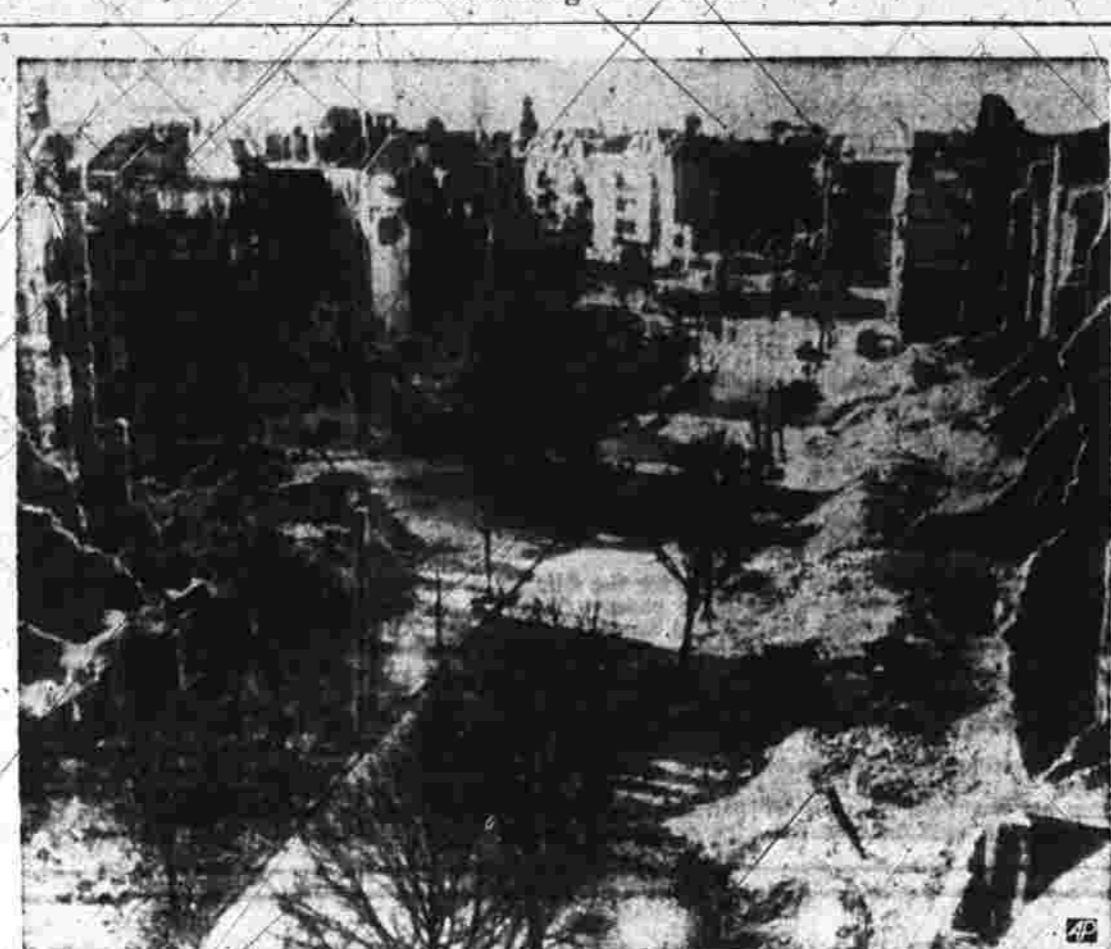

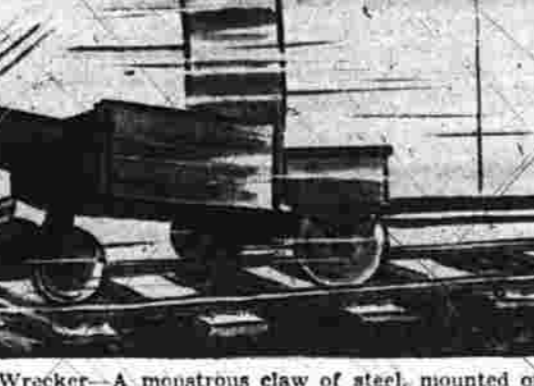
