19 Hospitals Get Penicillin

To Be Deposits for Limited Distribution in 13 State Cities.

Washington, May 6.—(AP)—Nineteen hospitals in 13 Connecticut cities were among a group selected by the Chemical Bureau of the War Production board today to serve as depot hospitals for the limited civilian distribution of penicillin.

The distribution is to be handled through the Office of Civilian Penicillin Distribution which has been established in Chicago by Dr. John N. McDermott as director.

Depot hospitals will be expected to recognize the receipt of other hospitals and when their need has been established, to furnish penicillin for their purchase to the best of the depot hospital's ability in consideration of the supply on hand.

decision must go to Lord Wavell's decision of India, who "once again has been hindered in his quick decisions, when action is called for."

Move Increases Prestige

In view of the country-wide appeals for Gandhi's release in the last several days, Lord Wavell's prompt move increased his prestige which already was high following his personal intervention in the Bengal famine and the personal interest he took when Bombay was shaken by two explosions on April 14.

Gandhi is spending his newly-gained freedom at "Parnakuti," the Poona mansion of Lady Vitthal Das Thackeray, an old friend of Gandhi and a warm supporter of the Indian National Congress of which Gandhi is the driving force.

Crowds Gather At Gates

Crowds of his followers, acting quickly on the news of his impending release, gathered at the gates of the Aga Khan's palace to greet him. Gandhi looked cheerful but tired and was conveyed immediately to "Parnakuti."

Also released were Dr. M. D. D. Gidder who attended Gandhi in his detention; Gandhi's private secretary, Miss Madeline Slade, the daughter of an English millionaire and a supporter of the Indian National Congress for many years, and Dr. Sushila Nayak, Dr. Gidder and Dr. Nayak issued a bulletin declaring that Gandhi has become very weak and there is physical and mental exhaustion "though he feels cheerful."

Blood Pressure Low

The bulletin "revealed" that Gandhi has had recurring malaria fever since April 14, and as a result he has lost weight and is suffering from anemia. He is delirious whenever his temperature goes up.

Strike Upsets Colt's Output

Union President Urges Return to Work to Get Wage Change.

Hartford, May 6.—(AP)—Production at Colt's Patent Fire Arms Manufacturing Company today was one day hampered by a wildcat walkout.

Comparatively few of the several hundred workers who quit Friday morning came back today, but James J. Connor, president of the union, said he hoped the difficulty could be cleared up by Monday.

Blamed on Mistaken Idea

Mr. Connor attributed the new walkout to a mistaken idea that the Regional War Labor board in Hartford had turned down the union's appeal for changing the Brown wage award, which cut piecework rates and other benefits.

Appealing for workers to return to work, Mr. Connor said: "Unless work is resumed, there is absolutely no chance of getting a change in the wage situation. The W.L.B. has not turned our appeal down. The board will need several days to study a transcript of the hearing. The walkout must end immediately. I am appealing for everyone to go back to work so we can get a favorable settlement as soon as possible."

Mr. Connor's statement was similar to one telegraphed to the union by Julius Ennspek, general secretary-treasurer of the United Electrical, Radio and Machine Workers of America, U.M.W.

Mr. Ennspek declared the work stoppage by a minority of workers was "ruining the efforts of the international union to bring about a satisfactory conclusion to the wage case."

Harming Other Workers

"The harmful action that is provoking this unproductive action," he said, "is harming the welfare of thousands of Colt workers. The interruption of production in the face of the coming invasion cannot be tolerated and spotlights the international union's strike should in no way be restricted with regard to making efforts to bring about a new situation in India."

In the events leading up to his detention, Gandhi demanded in July, 1942, that Britain had over the government of India entirely to Indians and withdraw the British, at war with the Japanese, refused, and Gandhi was confined, along with other leaders of the Indian Congress which had enjoined his demand.

Allied Planes Hit Balkans Again

First bomb to breach the dam. Saw Richards, an Australian pilot, keep his explosives make another break in the low wall.

As the last Allied flyer left the scene a wall of water followed by five even higher waves already was a mile downstream. The water began flooding over German-occupied Italian cities and the German defenses eroded opposite the British Eighth Army lines in the Ortona sector, 10 miles below the port of Pescara.

Expected to Sweep Away Bridges

The attack was carried out by Mustang and Kittyhawk fighters. In addition to softening German positions near the Adriatic, the water was expected to sweep away bridges vital to Axis military traffic in that long-stalemate sector.

An indication of what could be expected from the blasting of the dam was seen in the disastrous experience of the Italians in 1934 when they attempted to divert water through the sluices and inundated the town of Pescara to an average depth of three feet. It took a week then for the water to subside.

Germans Evacuate Civilians

The Germans are reported to have evacuated all Italian civilians beyond the Fifth Army's main front for a depth of 20 miles. Evacuated headquarters announced today.

It was explained that this meant the evacuation of several sizable towns within the 20-mile belt.

In the lower gargantuan sector of this front, an increase in infantry action was reported and in the rubber boots was a heavy patrol attempting to cross the stream.

On the beachhead and the Eighth Army front several minor clashes occurred. On the beachhead three German tanks and several buildings were knocked out by direct hits. At besieged Cassino, several enemy mortars and machine guns were silenced by Allied artillery and machine-guns.
