Attack Small Convoy British light naval forces in offensive sweeps of the French coast early yesterday attacked a small German convoy and set fire to two enemy vessels and damaged two others. The Admiralty announced today.

An Admiralty communiqué said the British vessels returned to sea early although there were a small number of casualties and superficial damage.

The communiqué said a medium size ship was hit by a torpedo and left enveloped in flames and a supply ship of medium size was damaged by gunfire.

In addition, the Admiralty said, an armed trawler was set afire and another heavily damaged.

The daylight offensive was started a little later than usual. In heavy early morning sunshine R. A. F. fighter squadrons followed by a more powerful bomber force were directed toward the continent. American Thunderbolts were spotted among the departing planes.

The R. A. F. night attack was a quick follow-up to a smash assault by 2,000 American bombers and fighters on five big Nazi synthetic oil plants.

Luftwaffe Hi Heavily Lounain, about 15 miles east of Brussels, was hit heavily by British bombers Thursday night, in the campaign to paralyze German military communications. Heavily, about 30 miles east of Louvain, was visited yesterday by Thunderbolts and fighter-bombers of the U. S. Ninth Air Force attacking at railroad bridges.

The British also hit industrial waters during the night. Resound heard sounds of heavy continuous bombardment across the channel early today, possibly from new P. A. F. attacks along the invasion coast.

The German aircraft warning service broadcast that no enemy raiders are over the "Eure" at noon but earlier the Luxembourg radio had announced the approach of enemy planes.

Severe Damage Caused Brussels reports, said the Louvain cathedral was almost completely destroyed by yesterday's attack and other severe damage was caused in the city.

The Berlin radio claimed the Americans lost 50 aircraft, including 12 big bombers in yesterday's attacks. A U. S. Strategic Air Force communiqué stated yesterday that 42 heavy bombers, and 10 fighters were lost and claimed destruction of 150 enemy aircraft.

### Empire Debate At London

Each of the three major allies of this war has its own alternative to the theory of a collective security type of peace to follow this war.

Russia has a seemingly hard and fast line of individual objectives she insists on having as a minimum guarantee of her own security. One having those guarantees, she is apparently willing to enter into a collective security system. This serious, vital question is whether the measures she is undertaking in the name of individual security will not defeat such a nature that they will not support the principles of collective security. Russia's insistence upon playing the game both ways is dangerous. But Russia, undoubtedly, justifies such a hard-boiled, expedient policy on the grounds that she does not know how good a system of collective security Britain and the United States are willing to share and maintain.

The alternative to a system of collective security is less clearly outlined. But the character are more obvious. It is a system of collective security impossible, we will, all in the interests of guaranteeing our own individual security, because we should not have any national interest ourselves, maintaining great armed forces, and vigorously extending our influence into many of the most vital to our military and economic well being.

In Britain, the alternative to collective security is somewhat similar. It has already been presented in the speeches of Ambassador Halifax and Premier Stimson, who have been urging that the British Commonwealth of Nations abandon the loose type of organization which has hitherto been its successful pride, and limit at the domestic level a close organization capable of forming a strong power politics unit in the post-war world.

By such means, if they should prove the winning trends, we would have a definitely power politics world, with Britain, the United States, and France as the three main powers, and each jealously claiming a great sphere of dominance and influence, and with all three rivals for the favor of the fourth potential great power, Russia. In such a situation, there would be every incentive for new war, and it was even more terrible and destructive than this one.

The vital debate over these alternatives is at the moment, taking place in London, where the Prime Minister's conference is in progress. In this debate, the most telling and logical blow against power politics has come from Prime Minister Mackenzie King of Canada, speaking against any trend toward greater power politics centralization of the British Empire structure.

Let us, by all means, "improve where we can, but in considering new methods of organization we can not be too careful to see that to our own people the new methods will not appear as an attempt to limit their freedom of movement, or to peoples outside the Commonwealth, as an attempt to establish a separate bloc. If, at the close of this war, the strength and unity of the Commonwealth are to be maintained, these ends will be achieved not by policies which are directed to King of the United States, but by policies which are shared by other nations. I am firmly convinced that the way to maintain our unity is to base that unity on principles which can be extended to all nations. I am equally convinced that the only way to maintain world unity is to base that unity on principles which can be universally applied."
