Will Eliminate Specific Tests

New Plan to Be Tried On Entrance Requirements at University.

Storrs, May 18.—All specific subject entrance requirements at the University of Connecticut have been waived according to a suggestion by the university senate. It was announced today. This new plan is to go into effect for the next three years as a trial.

On the basis of interviews with applicants for admission who did not meet the past pattern of high school course requirements in the state, it is evident that in many cases the choice of a high school curriculum is not based on whether or not the student will be a good candidate for college.

Requirements for Admission

The requirements for admission are now as follows:

1. Have graduated from or completed 16 units in an approved secondary school.
2. Have ranked in the upper quarter of his graduating class or make a satisfactory score on the scholastic aptitude examination.

Unity Needed To Win War

Conflict with Japan Might Drag Out for Years Otherwise.

New Haven, May 18.—(AP)—Unless American citizens and mainlanders the unity it displayed the day after Pearl Harbor, a high Army officer has declared, "our war with Japan may drag out years at an additional cost of hundreds of thousands of lives."

Speaking at a rally of Winchapeater Repeating Arms company employes yesterday, Col. Warren J. Clear, U. S. Military attaché in Tokyo from 1922 to 1926, said: "We still have a war to win, no matter what happens in Europe."

Japan Tough Fighting Man

The colonel, who went through the last days of Corregidor and who was evacuated from that island fortress in a submarine to Australia, termed the Japanese soldier "one of the toughest fighting men in the world" and said the Japanese leaders "are banking on our inability to drag the war out to a point where we will get tired of it and seek some kind of a compromise."

Colonel Clear said that the Japanese were able to obtain only a relatively few workable U. S. rifles and carbines when they overran Bataan and Corregidor.

"Guns, especially the Garands," he told the workers, "were destroyed or rendered useless by our men before they fell into the hands of the Japanese."

Marshall Field Sued by Avery

Chicago, May 18.—(AP)—A suit for \$1,000,000 against Marshall Field, publisher-editor of The Chicago Sun, was on file in U. S. District court today, instituted by Sewell L. Avery, a resident of Montgomery Ward and company, and charging Field "maliciously published untrue, false and defamatory statements" about Avery and his company.

The suit against Field was filed yesterday by Avery as an individual and it invoked Federal jurisdiction on the ground that Field is a resident of New York and Avery a resident of Illinois. It alleged Avery was libeled in articles written by two members of The Sun's Washington bureau, Thomas F. Reynolds and Charles O. Grady.

Former Soap Firm President Is Dead

Millinocket, Me., May 18.—(AP)—George C. Williams, 86, former president of the J. B. Williams Company of Glastonbury, Conn., manufacturer of nationally known soap products, died of heart disease Wednesday night at a fishing camp on Pansaduncook lake, 20 miles northwest of here.

The body of the retired soap manufacturer was brought to Millinocket yesterday and scheduled to be sent to his home in Farmington, Conn., today.

For many years an ardent fisherman and yachtsman, Williams had been at Oyster Bay since last Wednesday with a friend, James D. Wells, of Hartford.

No Clue Is Found In Girl's Death
