





War Plant Building Tale of Difficulties

Pratt and Whitney Factory in Kansas City Has Licked All But Manpower Problem.

By Arthur Edson Kansas City, May 24—(P)—The story of the first war plants has told; here's the story of one It's the story of the Pratt and Whitney airplane engine factory, one of the two largest of its kind. The tale of its difficulties is as omplicated as the 2,100 horsepower, 18-cylinder engine it pro-duces. And, although the plant is in production, all the answers haven't been found yet.
