Up to Parents to See Service People Get Chance to Ballot.

What are you doing so that your soldier son in the service can vote this fall?

Many people here in Manchester probably know little about what the government has actually done in planning for the men and women of the Armed Forces to cast their ballots in the national election this fall, as well as in the municipal elections here in Manchester.

Recently, the State of Connecticut's legislative body passed an amendment granting members of the service the right to vote in local as well as national elections. This means that the soldier or sailor absentee ballot. Also, men and women who have attained the age of 21 after entering the service may also apply. In their case, it has been arranged by the government in cooperation with the Department of War, that the soldier and women wish to be some voters, even in any commissioned officer of their particular branch. This can be done regardless of where they may be stationed.

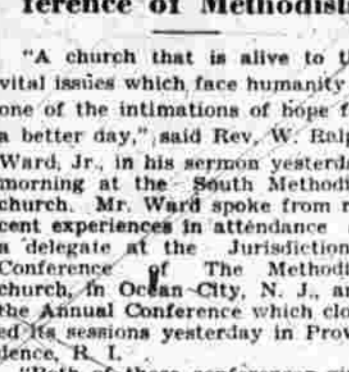
