Water Supply Is Inadequate

New Developments on Middle Turnpike in Need of Protection.

Commissioners of the South Manchester Fire District are not satisfied with the water furnished for fire purposes to the two developments on the south side of Middle turnpike, west, on both the west and east side of the South Manchester railroad tracks. This is in the South Manchester Fire District. The water is furnished by the Manchester Water Company and is not of sufficient volume, they claim. They assert that fire protection should come from the town-owned water system.

Town Must Buy Pipes
Because of the fire department's refusal to accept the present contract with the Manchester Water Company, which could be cancelled on one year's notice. He said the cost of the pipes that will have to be installed must be borne by the town-owned department at a price that would be agreed upon by the Public Utilities Commission.

Temporary Arrangement
The contract with the South Manchester Fire District, he said, called for a constant supply of water for fire purposes. To lay a 12-inch main through Middle turnpike, he said, would now cost about \$40,000. He presented a plan where it might be possible to help out some. This could be done, he said, by laying 300 feet of pipe from the west end of Hamlock street and then north along Essex street through land now owned by E. J. Holl, Mr. Holl, he said, would give permission for this new pipe to be laid at the main at that point made yesterday afternoon, showed 20 gallons a minute against about half of that amount from the hydrants in the new developments.

Looking to Future
