Local Fighter Pilot Tells of Downing Hun



Lt. Hebert Weber, in Battle with Nazi, Describes How He Forced Him to Disaster. An Eighth AAF Fighter Station, England—Two planes went into a better than four-hundred mile-per-hour dive, one pulled out and the other went straight into the ground, exploding and emitting a huge sheet of flames. The pilot that pulled out of the dive was 1st Lt. Hebert Weber, of Manchester, Conn., who received credit for the destruction of the less fortunate plane piloted by a Nazi. The action occurred during a bomber sweep mission near Steinbuder Lake, Germany. It was Lt. Weber's second victory over the Luftwaffe. This is how Lt. Weber, twenty-seven years old, P-47 Thunderbolt pilot, recounts the incident: "We were getting ready to chase about 12 enemy fighters when I spotted a single contrail a bit off the main body of German planes. I investigated and found it to be a lone Jerry in a silver Me 109. He started rolling his plane over and I went down to meet him. I was climbing, I looked back and saw the silver ship strike and saw the other pilot..."

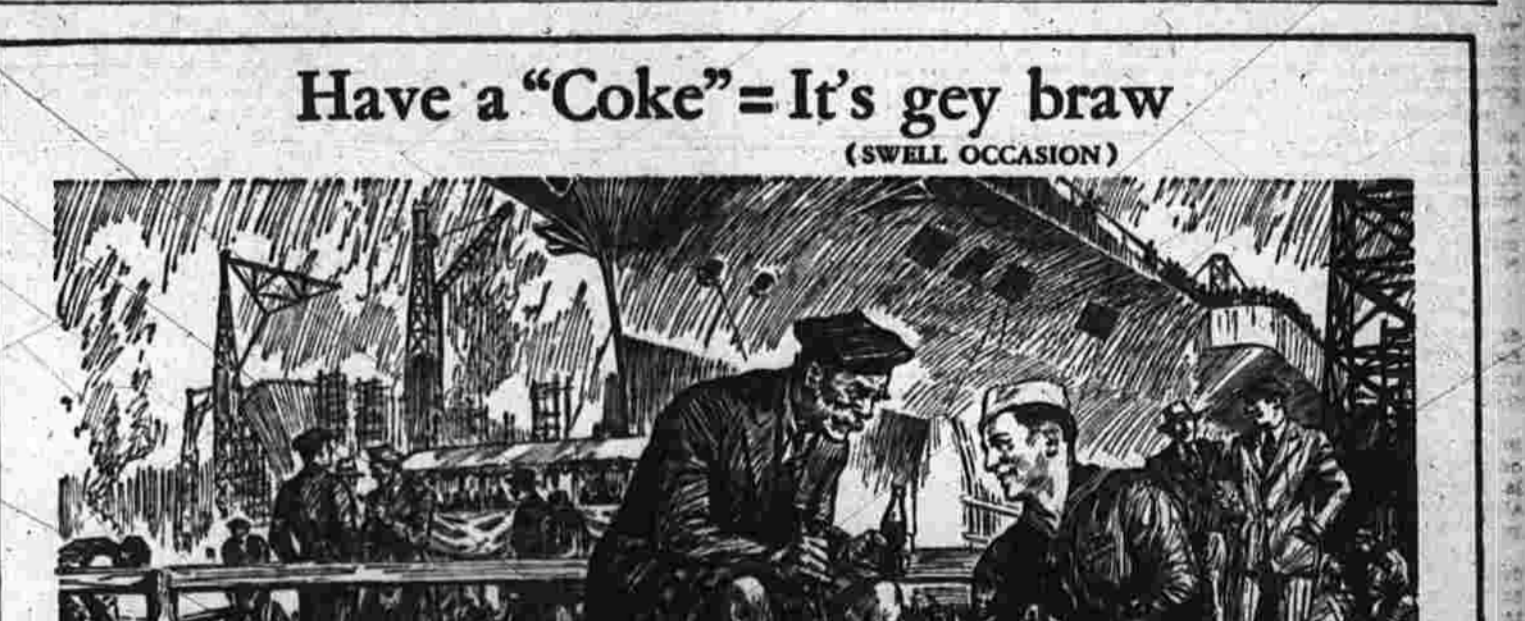

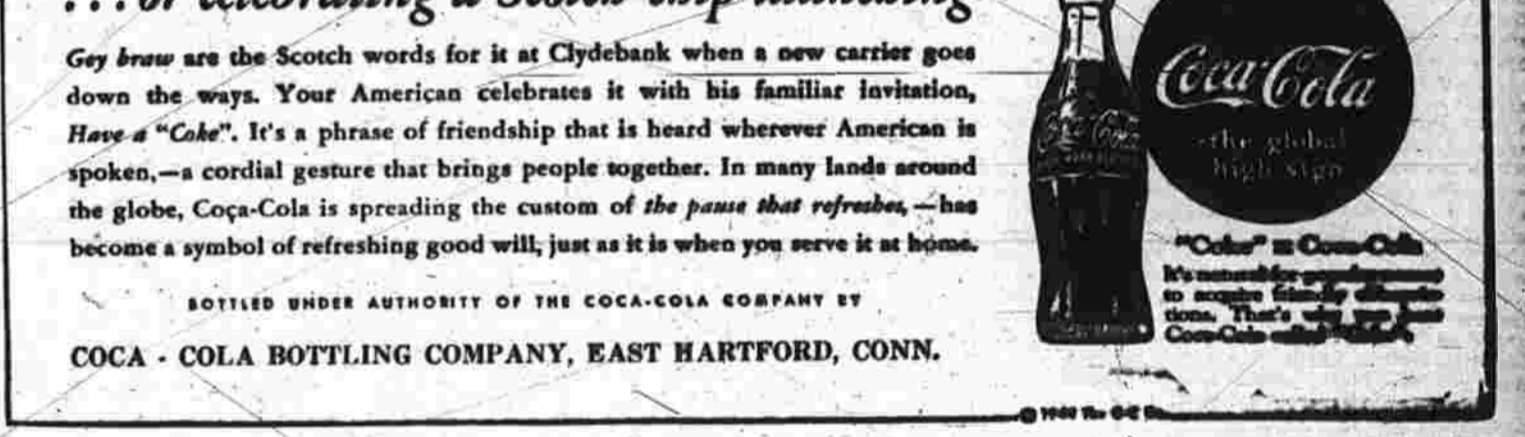
