### Built Puny Air Arm Into Powerful AAF

Editor's Note: Climaxing a notable career in aviation, Gen. H. H. "Happy" Arnold organized the "Happy" Army and Air Force recently raised Japan. Here is the story of the remarkable airman whose personal supervision of the Twentieth Air Force was only one of a series of major accomplishments in building up American air superiority.

Washington—Gen. Henry Harley Arnold has built this nation's puny little air force into the most powerful raiding and fighting organization in the world. The vigor and efficiency of his AAF administration have served to bring the General Arnold's name to our Number One Army still using the controls.

In April, 1911, 2nd Lt. "Happy" Arnold was one of the first five men sent by the Army to the Wright Brothers' field at Dayton, Ohio, where Orville Wright taught him to fly one of the kites that passed as an airplane in those days.

The course took two months. Arnold received his wings after 140 minutes of soloing, and received U. S. P. I. License No. 29. From that day, in this line, he has worked regularly if not continuously.

For his flying he has merely performed. He never got out now without a co-pilot. In that he is obeying his own order, issued when the death of Gen. Oscar Westover, in a crash at Burbank, Cal., west of the office of Chief of the Army Air Corps, to which Arnold was promoted. But his early records demonstrated that he is a top-notch flier in his own right.

See Records  
In June 1911, immediately upon graduation as a pilot, he became an instructor at the Army's new 1000-acre field at College Park, Md.

A year later he set an altitude record of 6540 feet in a Burgess Wright plane. In July and August, 1912, he made several records in Army-National Guard maneuvers in New York and Connecticut. In October, 1912, he won the first Mackay Trophy for the first reconnaissance flight—a 30-mile round-trip in a 40-horsepower Wright biplane. The plane's two propellers, in tandem, were operated from the motor by chains and sprockets like a bicycle and achieved the cruising speed of 45 miles an hour.

Arnold set on the wing. The air was so bumpy that part of the time he couldn't hold the plane. The feat was, in his time, an epic. He was the first man to fire a machine-gun from two fields on the first pilot to fly air mail—a five-mile hop between two fields on Long Island. He was the first man to direct artillery fire by observation in the air over a plane-carrier radio; he was to have been the first man to drop a bomb from a plane, but the craft wouldn't lift. ### Crooked Dollars Cross Path of Price Control

### Cheats Dip Sticky Fingers into American Pocketbooks to Boost Living Costs.

Washington, June 24.—The path of price controls is crossed by crooked dollars. Cheats dip their sticky fingers into American pocketbooks, and their tricks are widespread.

In the year ahead OPA—with a staff of lawyers and investigators totaling about 4700—will be a better job than it has been able to do so far. But without the help of local boards the job would be impossible.

Cheating At All Levels  
There are 600,000 food stores, 800,000 restaurants, and a total of 1,700,000 retail outlets. In addition are all the thousands of manufacturers and wholesalers. The cheating occurs at all levels.

Counterfeit Ration Coupons  
Sugar—Illegal OPA-makers counterfeit ration coupons to get the sugar or even set up phony soft-drink firms in order to buy from the wholesaler.

Waste-paper—Upgrading again. Collecting, upgrading, selling the work and badly needing paper for their own use. Mills doing work within OPA regulations, they refuse to pay the crooked prices.

Meat—Starts with slaughterers. They sell to wholesalers, charge OPA prices for the record, and then demand hidden cash or the side. Wholesalers work the same racket with retailers. Retailers make up for this extra cost by giving you short weight or charging for a better grade of meat than you get.
