Warren Cheered As Martin Sees Reckoning Near

(Continued from Page One)

...in the last few years will extend to the nation in 1944. Urging Warren to drop some clearing of the vice presidential picture imposed by Governor Warren's own delegation were reported urging him to state he will accept second place if offered it.

Supporters of Gov. John W. Bricker for president still fighting for the nomination, continued "unconventional tactics by the Dewey camp" was reacting in the form of new suggestions of interest in and support for the Ohioan.

Warren, most discussed possibility for second place on the ticket, told the delegation before the convention opened Monday that he did not want his name placed in nomination or a California vote if someone else nominated him.

With the renewed pressure on Warren and amid discussion also of Gov. John W. Bricker of Ohio, Gov. Dwight Green of Nebraska, Gov. Dwight Green of Illinois—the convention looked for some sign of a trend and decision today. California called a caucus at which it was believed Warren's position was under discussion.

More than in California, Warren himself has taken the position he was elected in California on a platform calling for the development of projects that will require years. Moreover, he has indicated that he is "not in a hurry" to the party in California than in Washington. But he is a staunch party man.

Today's convention program in Chicago, clearing Chicago stadium budget, starting with the address of Rep. Joseph W. Martin of Massachusetts, permanent chairman of the convention, and followed tonight by speeches by Governor Warren and President Hoover and Congressmen's Rep. He told reporters: "I am going to stay in this fight until I die. The fight is for every citizen of this country. It is for the peace and the welfare of our people."

The third session of the convention was slow getting under way. At 10:30 a. m. (e. w. t.), only a few delegates were in their seats and the balcony ushers hadn't done any work at all.

Warren, temporary chairman, on the convention floor where delegates began pumping his hand, complimenting him on his keynote speech last night. Some were urging him to go out for the vice-presidential nomination.

Warren finally stepped for the first time on the convention floor. Rev. Joseph Robinson, pastor of the First Baptist church, St. Paul, Minn., delivered the invocation. Miss Mildred Maule of East St. Louis, Ill., sang the national anthem.
