





### Beating Victim Gains Slightly

#### Penicillin Appears to Be Easing Mrs. Higginson Out of Coma

Boston, June 30.—Penicillin appeared today to be easing Mrs. Frances Lee Higginson, West Cornwall, Conn. society woman, out of a 14-day coma caused by a beating inflicted by an intruder in her home on the night of June 15. For the first time since she arrived at the Deaconess hospital two days after the vicious attack, Mrs. Higginson showed signs of regaining consciousness by moving her hands yesterday. Hospital attendants reported her condition "fair" and said she appeared to be gaining slightly.

Meanwhile, police, apparently stymied in their efforts to obtain a definite clue, awaited her return to consciousness in the hope that she might be able to identify her assailant.

But attending physicians would not hazard a guess as to whether Mrs. Higginson, wife of Lieutenant Commander Higginson of the U. S. Navy, member of a prominent Boston banking family, would be able to recall events at the time she was attacked.

#### Memory May Be Hazy

They pointed out that she was so brutally beaten—suffering 23 head wounds—that her memory might be hazy when she regains consciousness.

Mrs. Higginson, a descendant of Henry Ward Beecher, famous author and preacher, was discovered unconscious in the living room of her fashionable residence several hours after she returned from a party at the home of friends.

Police said that her assailant's first blow probably felled her and that additional blows were rained on her. Authorities, however, were unable to discover a weapon and said they could find no evidence of an attempt to criminally assault or rob the woman.

#### Police Informed by Neighbor

Authorities learned of the attack from Mrs. James Thurber, a neighbor and wife of the husband who in response to a telephone call to the Higginson home, was told by a seven-year-old son of the victim that "money is dead on the floor right here."

Police said that Mrs. Higginson's wrist watch was stopped at 11:15 p. m., possibly the time of the attack.

Scoville, daughter of the late William H. Scoville, registrar of Hampton Institute in Virginia for many years, and a granddaughter of the institute's founder, Gen. Samuel G. Armstrong.

### Democrats Given Warning on Split

Birmingham, Ala., June 30.—Warning that a split in the Democratic party would mean "the certain election of a Republican," Senator Claude Pepper (D., Fla.) charged here last night that "the issue is being made the football of selfish and sinister forces."

#### The senator spoke at the 16th annual banquet of the Association of County Commissioners and Probate Judges of Alabama.

Pepper declared that the "Texas revolt" is merely an attempt to disenfranchise a large number of voters and that "one of the leading forces in the attempt to defile the Democratic tradition in Texas is an ex-congressman, a defeated Republican from the north, working closely with a group of northern capitalists within the Republican party."

### Board Orders Election Held

Washington, June 30.—The National Labor Relations board reported today it has directed that an election be held within 30 days of June 28 whereby the employees of the Connecticut branches of three brewing concerns may choose a collective bargaining agent.

#### The firms involved are the Bridgeport, Conn., branches of Liebherr Breweries, Inc., and Jacob Ruppert, Inc., and the Fairfield, Conn., branch of F. M. Schaeffer Brewing company.

The employees will vote on whether they want to be represented by Local No. 40 of the International Union of United Brewery, Flour, Cereal & Soft Drink Workers of America.

### Workers Overpaid By Bankrupt Firm

Seattle, June 30.—A 12th Regional War Labor board panel has returned a finding that the now bankrupt Columbia Shipbuilding and Drydock company of Portland overpaid employees \$560,000 in violation of the wage stabilization act—a decision which opens the way for a possible penalty of double that amount.

### Regional WLB officials expressed the belief it was the largest potential penalty that a panel finding has made possible under the act.

Panel Chairman Clark Kerr said yesterday the \$560,000 finding will be reported to government officials.
