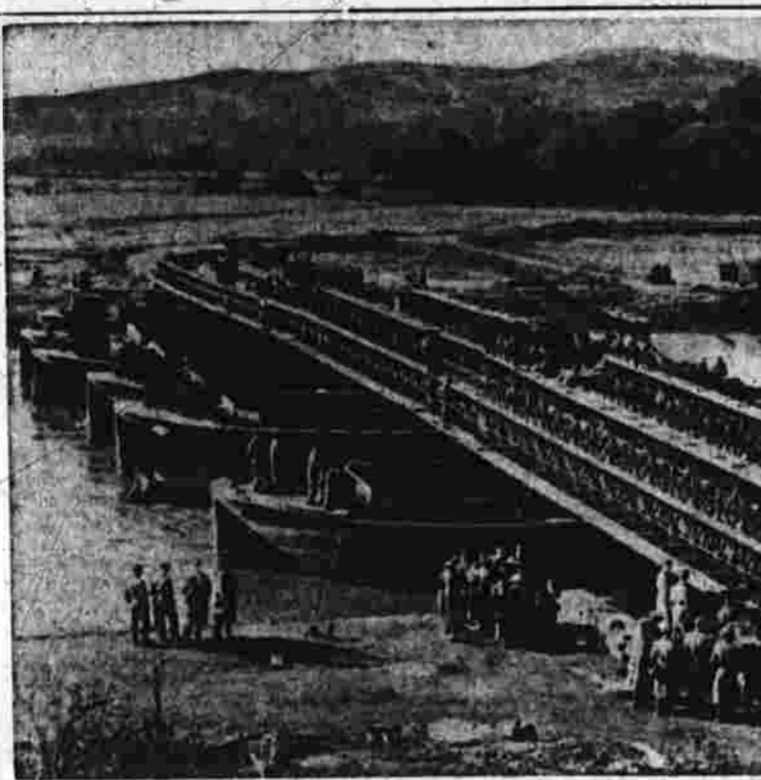

Two Airmen Win Highest War Medal

Washington, July 3.—Two airmen who died in an effort to land a bomber while trying to save the injured pilot have been awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor, the nation's highest military honor. The War department, in announcing the awards last night, said the medals had been conferred on Second Lieut. Walter E. Triemer, Aurora, Ill., and Sgt. Arthur J. Matthews, New York. Both Triemer and Matthews showed "unparalleled courage" in the rescue of a bomber which was shot down over the English Channel on Feb. 20, 1943. Triemer, the navigator, and Matthews, the engineer-gunner, tried to land the ship after the pilot, Second Lieut. Charles F. Wood, N. D., was killed.

Washington, July 3.—The Office of War Administration promised today to inform congressmen promptly how many more they can expect to pay for shirts, dresses, suits, pillow cases, etc. Under price advances authorized for cotton textile mills, about one-third of all cotton fabric output will command higher prices at the mill, said OPA Administrator Chester Bowles. Great Decisions Come Hard

This nation makes most of its great decisions with seeming ease, and only after long and arduous struggle and often tragic attempts to get along without dramatic change.

It was in that way that our first great decision—the decision which we celebrate tomorrow—was made: The Declaration of Independence was the result of a series of momentous decisions which burst upon the country over-night to be welcomed with unanimous agreement.

As it was, the decision was only welcomed and supported because as the document itself took pains to prove, the sufferings and trials and penalties of controversy with the mother country had become a burden for a long period of time.

At this present time in our history we are approaching a new decision, one that is of a different direction, no less vital in importance. It is a decision which, like our first great decision, is a subject of continuing controversy.

But it is an approaching decision which is being moulded in the fires of tragedy and trouble, a decision which is coming because we are beginning to conclude that there is no other way to solve our problems.

Just as, in 1776, we finally decided that we must separate ourselves from all other ties in order to solve our problem so, in 1944, we are treading to the decision that we must seek and maintain ties with the rest of the world in order to solve our own problems.

There is nothing about or about this decision, we have tried every kind of compromise.
