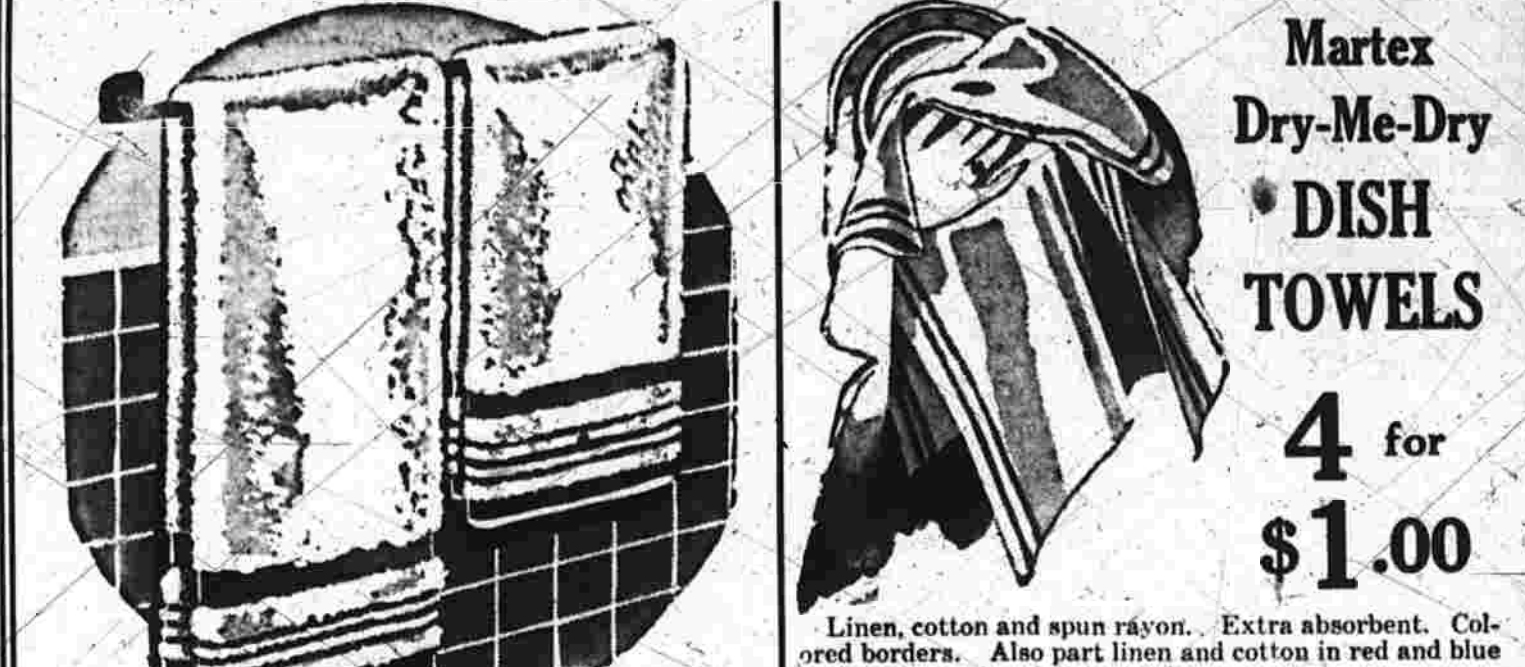

Her father, a family of five, escaped from France in the exodus that preceded the fall of France. Lilian was in the French provinces when the Germans invaded, and finally reached New York, where she was educated recently from Barnard College, Columbia University.
After that she joined the French Women's Air Service and is now at Ft. Meade, with a group of other French girls, who are enlisted in their country's service and are to be transferred to Africa, where the French women's military services have been training for some time.
Lilian will take off as the first of the French Pelles de l'Air (daughters of the air) to leave America for France. When that is finished she will go to help fight the war on French soil. And later she hopes to become a member of the army of French women whom she believes will take an active part in re-establishing France as a sovereign power.

Capture of Kormanor air field was announced today by Gen. Douglas MacArthur.

Together Eight Then Expected

At Saipan, which is 3,800 miles from Manila, the coast gun that was at Pearl Harbor 4 years ago, Nimitz conceded, the fighting had been tougher than expected.

Our troops have the situation well in hand and I think our forces will push on rapidly to the (northern) end of the island, Nimitz said, at a diminishing rate in casualties.

Despite Japan's carrier and other warship losses June 10 in the Philippine sea, the enemy Navy's heavy losses considered that we take into account the estimated capability of the Jap fleet in every move we make, Nimitz cautioned.

That observation heightened interest in Manila, where the Japs pushed into the Volcano and Bonin islands to within less than 100 miles of Tokyo.

Nearing Peak of Efficiency

"I believe we are approaching the peak of our efficiency in handling ships and planes," said Nimitz. "We will have put ashore and guarded the Saipan invaders without losing a single warship so far."

Nimitz's attention was directed to the current drive of the Japanese to set up a railroad-linked defense zone all along the China coast.

"If anything, that would make us go faster (across the Pacific) if that were possible," he said.

Nosefor Invasion Spectacular

MacArthur's nosefor invasion on the road back to the Philippines was spectacular. Spence Davis, Associated Press war correspondent aboard a C-47 troop carrier, watched the big sky train of George fighting men less than 500 feet from the ground for the Independence day salute of Korea's savior. Some troops "chuted with broadsword, halberd, and Chinese-guns and mortars. They landed on captured Kamiri air field which Australian engineers rapidly are restoring to use.

Chinese Taking Heavy Toll of Japanese

Chungking, July 6—(AP)—Spirited attacks on the enemy in many sectors of the Hunan and Kwangtung fronts, combined with determined resistance in defense of the vital Hunan province railway town of Hengyang, are combining to take a heavy toll of Japanese troops striving for complete control of the Canton-Hankow railroad, the Chinese high command announced last night.

A communication estimated the Japanese had lost more than 6,000 dead, including a high command officer, in the last 10 days of the bitter fighting in the Hunan defenses and various suburban districts of Hengyang.

Striking on both sides of the Siang river, Chinese troops routed the enemy at Puchuan, near Hengyang, and at Huanling, southwest of Liling, and took a large number of enemy strong points, the communication said.

More than 1,000 enemy dead and wounded were counted in the vicinity of Tungting and more than 200 Japanese were killed in the suburbs of Shingyang, about 50 miles north of Hengyang, the communication added.

On the Kwangtung front further south the Chinese reported the capture of Longzhou, some 60 miles northeast of Canton. In the Tungting sector, about 40 miles northwest of Canton, Chinese forces were reported beating back the enemy in the eastern part of the south bank of the Pei river, and in the western suburb were wiping out the Japanese forces, the communication declared.

The Chinese in Hengyang received "many tons" of ammunition dropped to them by bombing B-29 Mitchell bombers, an American 14th Air Force communication said.

Japs Report Islands Shelled by Cruisers

New York, July 6—(AP)—The Tokyo radio said today that a force of United States cruisers had shelled Tinian and Guam islands yesterday and that two other islands in the Marianas—Rota and Pagan—had been attacked by American planes.

The broadcast, recorded by the Federal Communications Commission, described the attack upon Tinian as a "combined operation" with about 120 planes blasting the island while the cruisers hammered it with high explosives in the morning and again in the afternoon.

Rota was hit by 20 to 30 planes and Pagan by 30 planes, Tokyo said.

FPC monitors said atmospheric conditions prevented clear reception of the portion of the broadcast dealing with the attack on Tinian, but Tokyo seemed to be reporting that American gun crews on neighboring Saipan had joined in the bombardment of Tinian.

Five Jap Ships Destroyed

In another broadcast recorded by the FPC, Tokyo quoted a Japanese imperial headquarters communication as saying five Japanese ships and 50 planes had been destroyed by the U. S. Naval Task Force, which thrust into the Bonin and Volcano Islands to within some 600 miles of the Japanese homeland on July 5-6.

Admiral Chester W. Nimitz previously had announced at least five Japanese ships were sunk and dozens others damaged by the thrusts, during which installations on Twa Jima and Haha Jima were attacked.

The Japanese asserted they had downed 70 American planes, while an official U. S. statement said six were lost.

cast recorded by the Soviet monitor in London, said the Germans were counter-attacking in the Baranovsk area, 81 miles southwest of Minsk, with heavy tanks and aircraft. "Particularly force fighting is going on," the broadcast said.

Reuters quoted the Moscow Soviet news agency as saying other German counter-attacks were reported west of Molochno, but declaring "the Red Army, however, is sweeping the Germans away in its drive to the west."

Great waves of Stormoviks (dive-bombers) hunted out the German salients in the Pinsk marshes, blasting them from low levels and driving the Nazis along the few roads leading back toward the Gorn River and Pinsk.

Challenges to Central Position

Military observers in Moscow saw in this new activity through the Pinsk region a challenge to Hitler's whole central position and, if coupled with the southern White Russian offensive, believed it should carry straight to Brest-Litovsk and Warsaw.

The Russians might push toward the Berlin-Winnipeg-Daugavpils-Pskov-Leningrad railway — one of the main arteries of the Baltics, was under pressure not only from Bagration's First Baltic Army but also from Cherniakovsky's cavalry and tanks.

Yesterday Bagration was 38 to 40 miles east of the railway in the region of St. Myasny, 40 miles from the Pinsk marshes, and today Cherniakovsky's approached points nearby the same distance away as he moved on from Smerskone.

At the south of these two powerful pushes, Russian troops rolling on west of Minsk toward Baranovsk, in a fierce storming fight, reached a place 18 miles away, with the main escape route to Wilno shut.

Crossing Vilya River

The Red Army is crossing the Vilya river west of Smerskone, according to a dispatch from Red Star Correspondent Yakov Miletsky, and numerous Germans are fleeing down side roads with the main escape route to Wilno shut.

There were numerous reports of the Germans fighting back ferociously as they were being driven back into Wilno. Undoubtedly they are trying to make a stand, but the power of the Soviet offensive appears too much for them at present.

Better weather brought the Soviet Air Force into strength. Stormoviks, bombers and fighters, poured down the Vilya highway, blasting and strafing every German effort to regroup.

after they had crushed determined enemy resistance just south of the town, which is 42 miles east of Siena and 88 miles southeast of Florence.

One Eighth Army column was only three miles from the important road center of Arezzo after struggling through mud and elaborate German demolitions. At one point the Germans blew out 120 feet of roadway to impede pursuit.

Allied headquarters reported a bitter battle in progress eight miles south of Arezzo near the Adriatic coast. In that area the Eighth Army occupied Badia and San Sabino, retaining the latter against a counter-attack.

Catandardo also was taken, and directly on the coast, the Allied troops entered the outskirts of Numana.

French Score Gains

On the Fifth Army's right wing, French troops battered through German opposition to Highway 48 between Colle di Val D'Elsa and Volterra in fresh advances of one to four miles. The French also thrust out some eight miles north and west from the meeting, the greatest opposition at Abbadia and Monte Prigioni to the northwest.

R. A. F. bombs hammered the rail yards at Verona in northern Italy last night, a few hours after American Eighth and 15th Air Force bombers had pummeled targets of southern France. Flying Fortresses bombed railroads at Montpellier and teamed with Liberators in attacking Bessieres. Other Liberators concentrated bombs on submarine pens at Toulon.

Ten heavy bombers and one other Allied plane were lost. Three enemy fighters were shot down.
