
Top War Loan Quota Here Over 1-2 Million

Chairman Alvord Highly Pleased at Record as Fifth Drive Closes; 'E' Bond Percentage High

On the last day of the Fifth War Loan Drive Chairman Harold Alvord of the War Finance Committee said this morning it was his great pleasure to be able to announce that Manchester has exceeded its quota by nearly \$400,000. This is indeed very gratifying in the face of the fact that this drive was the largest ever and the total sales to date stands at \$2,272,000 as compared to \$1,900,000 for the same period last year.

The "E" bond sales which have been lagging everywhere hit a record high of 83 per cent of the quota as compared with a 46 per cent average through the state. Our "E" bond quota was \$100,000 and to date sales have amounted to \$147,848.

Chairman Alvord said that he was especially pleased with this record and again takes this opportunity to thank the hundreds of bond sales workers who did such a thorough and splendid job of bringing this figure up to its present mark and the percentage so much higher than the average for the state. Chairman Alvord said that although the drive officially closes tonight, all "E" bonds bought during the balance of the month will be credited to the drive. The women's committee which had charge of the house-to-house sales campaign was organized and functioned very efficiently under the leadership of Mrs. John F. Cheney, Jr.

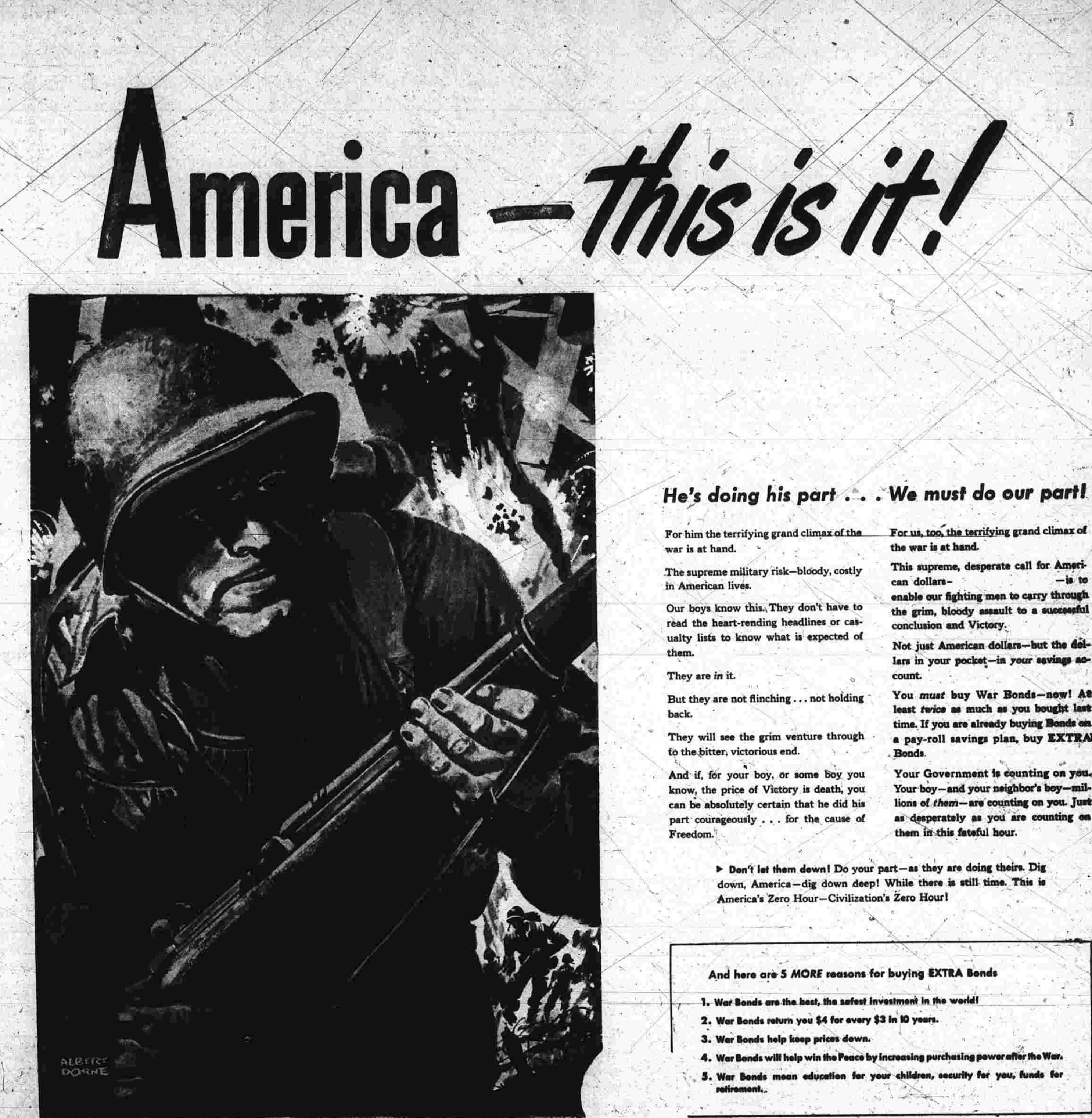
