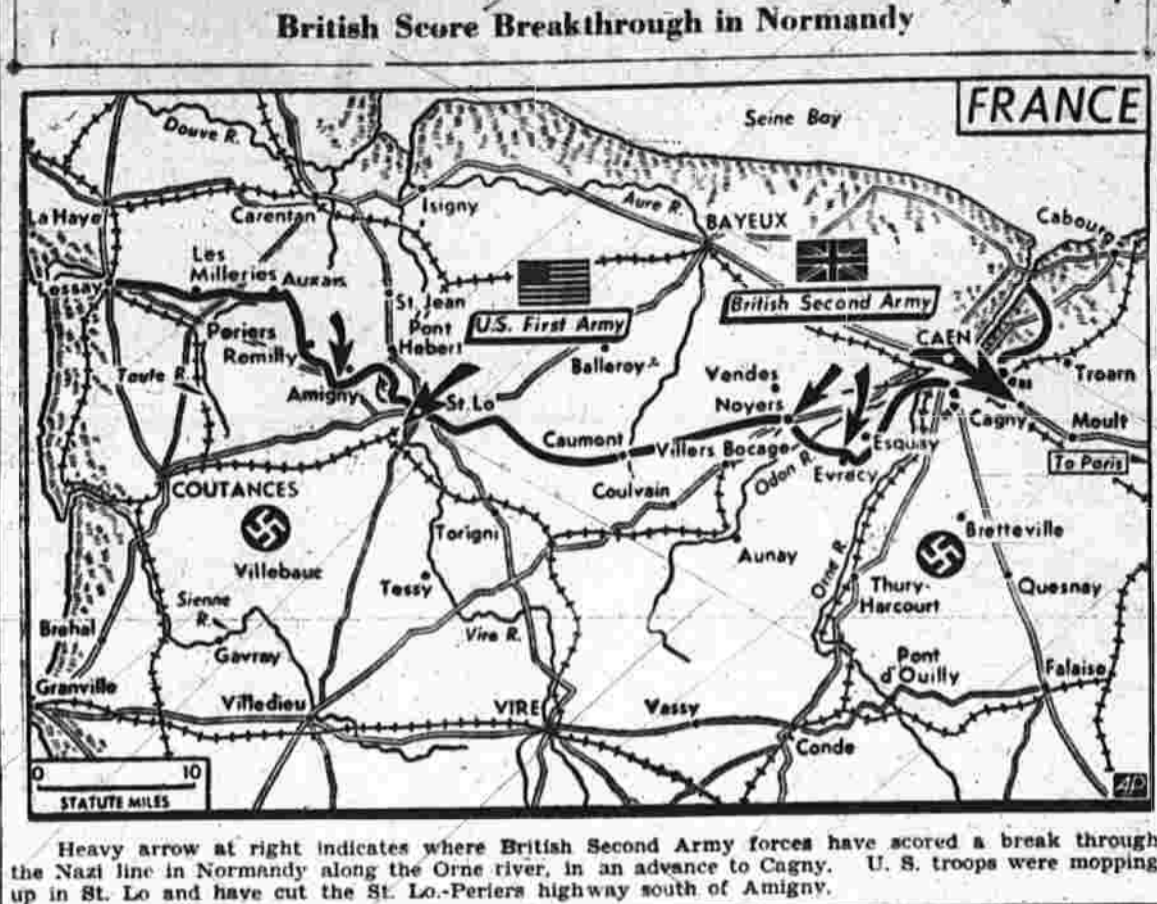

May Quit Bed Fourth Day After Child Born

Chicago, July 20.—(AP)—Mothers may safely be permitted to get out of bed on the third or fourth day after birth of their babies if there are no complications, Dr. Morris L. Rotstein of Baltimore reported today in the Journal of the American Medical Association.
