Drive 1,500 Yards Forward
The only advance in the American sector was south of the St. Lo. Bayeux road, about four miles east of St. Lo. Lieut. Gen. Omar N. Bradley's column drave about 1,500 yards forward. Only local clashes were reported on the rest of the front.

Overnight rains turned secondary roads on the American sector into sticky lanes and mud puddles, restricting operations to sporadic artillery fire.
