"By immediate and vigorous action by loyal officers and men of the Army at home, the traitor clique was wiped out or arrested in the matter of a few hours," Hitler said.

"A small circle of unscrupulous officers had made an attempt to murder me and the general start and to seize power in the state," but "Providence caused the attempt to miscarry."
