

By James Marlow Washington, July 26-(A)-Since the Brewster Aircraft workers went on their stay-in strike last May because the Navy, suddenly threw them out of jobs by can-celling the contract, there have been about 150 war production cutmen say: About 143 involved no employ-

The remaining seven of the 150 cut-backs did involve employment, such as layoffs. But a strike occurred in only one of them. That was in the Worthington Pump Machinery company in Holyoke, Mass., where the workers went on

While the Brewster workers were "staying-in" — and seeing that that might happen repeatedly if workers in other plants were suddenly told their work had ended—the War Production board took steps to prevent a repetition.

A "staff" of government officials was appointed, such as representatives of the Army, Navy, Maritime commission, and Office of Civilian Requirements.

This was a typical problem they had to consider: Suppose the Army had five war plants making bomb-sights but now needed only four to continue the job. Which of the five should stop making them?

The Army might decide Plant "A" should stop because the cost was too high there. But Plant "A" might be in an area where there was plenty of labor available. Shutting down that plant, would simply mean throwing people out of toks in a place where lobs were
