Governors charged that there had been a "constant grating for government." They said that only through cooperation and "a high degree of understanding" could this nation's system of government be made to work.

"This can be accomplished when all parts of the country are represented in the councils of the Federal government," the report said.

The report also called for a "re-organization of the Federal Government" and for a "re-organization of the State Government."

There have been too many studies with too little action on this most fundamental and vital problem confronting our Federal and State governments," the report said.

"In this connection, the Republican executives believe that while there must be no political meddling and no political interference, it is the duty of the Federal Government to see that the Federal Government is not run as a business."

Calling for an end to the "duplication" of Federal and local governmental services, the report said that executives must be on the alert to "see that no funds are not wasted and that the number of employees is no larger than is absolutely necessary."

Reorganization of the Federal administration of welfare agencies was urged by the governors, who said that efforts of the states to develop coordinated programs "are frequently thwarted by the competitive demands of Federal bureaus operating great-scale programs in those related fields."

The report outlined a social welfare program in which the states and local communities would improve existing hospital, clinic, treatment, visiting nurses and other health activities with the work of existing agencies more closely integrated.

"There should be no political control of the profession of medicine," the report said.

Administration inefficient. Declaring that the New Deal's administration of existing labor statutes "has been inefficient and arbitrary and has tended to promote rather than aid industrial strife," the governors called for "an immediate drastic change in the spirit and methods of administration of these laws."

The group endorsed Federal regulation of wages, hours and child labor, saying that the states should supplement these minimum standards in line with local conditions.

The governors repeated a Republican platform pledge in calling for "cooperation, coordination and understanding" between Federal and state governments in the development of water resources.

"Each development," the report said, "should recognize and fully protect the rights and interests of the people of the several states in the use and control of water for present and future irrigation, waterways, power, flood control and other beneficial uses."

The main points in the policy pronouncement were issued in the wake of a meeting which found the Republican organization pooling for a fight and challenging the New Deal's approach to domestic problems.

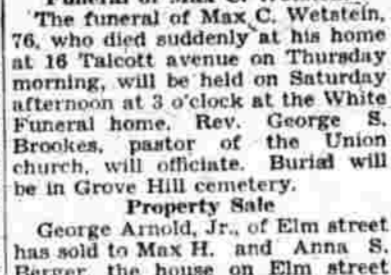
